# Children's Grief & Loss Support in Rural Iowa

Program Update | May 2023

Addressing trauma, grief & loss through programs in Iowa schools.





EveryStep's Grief and Loss Services – Home of Amanda the Panda, continues to expand school-based support services throughout rural Iowa. In October 2022, two part-time staff were added to facilitate support groups in the areas surrounding Centerville and Creston. The new staff were integrated into the communities they served, where they continue to make connections with local principals, guidance counselors, school nurses, and teachers. The rural support staff provide 6-week peer support groups where students share their grief stories, connect with peers, and learn resilience skills to feel better equipped to cope with grief in healthy ways.

## **Support Group Survey Results**

**89%** felt comfortable expressing thoughts and feelings about their loss

**92%** felt connected to their peers within the support group

 $\pmb{88\%} \ \text{reported that they improved their knowledge of coping skills}$
