# JOHN F. HERMAN DIES, PORTLAND


Was Formerly Well-Known Boone Banker. Remains to Be Returned for Funeral

# SET MINIMUM FOR STOCK MART DROPS

London, Sept. 27-Stock market jobbers with the approval and full support of the government and London stock exchange committee decided today to fix minimum prices for future declines in giltedged securities.

Declines in gilt-eidged issues hereafter will be conducted by "negotiation," with one point of difference between buying

For example, the war loan will be fixed at 93 for buyers and 94 for sellers. These prices represent approximately a seven-point drop as compared to two weeks ago.

Meanwhile, there were hectic dealings in dollars on the foreign market. Shortly before noon the rate was about \$4.74 to the pound sterling.
