PAG LIN SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 2009 1 1 ${\tt 3}$ A JOINT RESOLUTION 4 AUTHORIZING THE TEMPORARY USE AND CONSUMPTION OF WINE IN THE 1 1 STATE CAPITOL IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE 2004 ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MIDAMERICAN CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF LAW 1 6 1 LIBRARIANS. 1 Я WHEREAS, the MidAmerican Chapter of the American 1 10 Association of Law Librarians is a prestigious group 1 11 representing information resource specialists in all areas of 1 12 research in both the public and private sectors; and WHEREAS, the annual meeting of the MidAmerican Chapter of 1 13 14 the American Association of Law Librarians addresses the major 1 15 issues facing libraries, staff, and library users at all 1 16 levels; and 1 17 WHEREAS, wine is customarily served at social events for 1 18 member participants attending the annual meeting; and 19 WHEREAS, under 11 IAC 100.4(8), which prohibits the 20 consumption of alcoholic beverages on the capitol complex, it 1 1 21 is not possible to serve wine at social events in the State 1 22 Capitol; NOW THEREFORE, 1 23 1 24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 1 2.5 Section 1. Notwithstanding 11 IAC 100.4(8) and any 27 contrary provisions of chapter 123, prohibiting the use and 28 consumption of alcoholic beverages in public places, wine may 1 26 1 1 1 29 be used and consumed within the State Capitol at a social 30 event, to be held on or around October 15, 2004, hosted by 31 local membership committees in conjunction with the 2004 32 Annual Meeting of the MidAmerican Chapter of the American 33 Association of Law Librarians, if the person providing the 1 1 34 food and wine at the social event possesses the appropriate 35 valid liquor control license.
