Section 1. Section 170.4, Code Supplement 2003, is amended
 2 to read as follows:

      170.4 REOUIREMENTS FOR KEEPING WHITETAIL -- FENCE
 4 CERTIFICATION.
     A landowner shall not keep whitetail as farm deer, unless
 6 the whitetail is kept on land of any number of acres which is
 7 enclosed by a fence. The fence must be constructed and
 8 maintained as prescribed by rules adopted by the department.
 9 A landowner shall not keep the whitetail unless the fence is
10 certified in a manner and according to procedures required by
11 the department. The fence shall be constructed and maintained
12 to ensure that whitetail are kept in the enclosure and that
13 other deer are excluded from the enclosure. A fence that is
14 constructed on or after May 23, 2003, shall be at least eight
15 feet in height above ground level. The department of
16 agriculture and land stewardship may require that the fence is
17 inspected and approved prior to certification. The department
18 of natural resources may periodically inspect the fence
19 according to appointment with the enclosure's landowner.

                             EXPLANATION
21
     During the 2003 legislative session the General Assembly
22 passed House File 624 (2003 Acts, chapter 149) regulating farm
23 deer, including whitetail deer. The bill effectively
24 transferred regulatory authority from the department of
25 natural resources under Code chapter 484 (which supervises
26 hunting preserves) to the department of agriculture and land
27 stewardship under new Code chapter 170. That Code chapter
28 does not currently establish minimum acreage restrictions.
29 The department's administrative rules provide that an
30 enclosure must include at least 320 contiguous acres.
31 bill expressly provides that there is no minimum acreage
32 requirement.
