A BILL FOR

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1 An Act authorizing the use of investigational, experimental, new,
      or unconventional medical treatment.
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3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 148.14 ACCESS TO MEDICAL
- 2 TREATMENT -- INVESTIGATIONAL, EXPERIMENTAL, OR UNCONVENTIONAL
- 3 MEDICAL TREATMENT.
- 4 l. This section shall be known as and may be cited as the
- 5 "Access to Medical Treatment Act".
- 6 2. For the purpose of this section, unless the context
- 7 otherwise requires, "physician" means a person licensed by the
- 8 board of medical examiners to practice medicine and surgery or
- 9 osteopathic medicine and surgery.
- 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an
- ll individual shall have the right to be treated by a physician
- 12 for an illness or disease with any investigational,
- 13 experimental, new, or unconventional medical treatment that is
- 14 desired by the individual or is authorized by the individual's
- 15 legal guardian or attorney in fact under chapter 144B,
- 16 providing that all of the following circumstances are
- 17 applicable:
- 18 a. The individual has been personally examined by the
- 19 physician.
- 20 b. A reasonable basis is not present to conclude that the
- 21 medical treatment, when administered as directed, poses an
- 22 unreasonable and significant risk of danger to the individual.
- 23 c. The physician has provided the individual with both an
- 24 oral explanation and a written statement that discloses the
- 25 facts regarding the nature of the medical treatment and
- 26 specifically indicates that the treatment offered is
- 27 investigational, experimental, new, or unconventional. If the
- 28 medical treatment offered involves a drug or medical device,
- 29 the explanation and statement shall disclose whether or not
- 30 the drug or medical device has been approved by the United
- 31 States food and drug administration and any material risks of
- 32 the drug or medical device that are generally recognized by a
- 33 reasonably prudent physician. The individual or the
- 34 individual's legal guardian or attorney in fact shall
- 35 acknowledge with a signature receipt of the explanation and

1 statement.

2 4. A physician's provision of medical treatment to an

3 individual in accordance with this section shall not by itself

4 constitute or be considered to be unprofessional practice or

5 conduct.

EXPLANATION

7 This bill allows a physician to authorize the use of

8 investigational, experimental, new, or unconventional medical

9 treatment provided the physician has personally examined the

10 individual, there is no reason to conclude that the treatment

11 poses an unreasonable or significant risk to the individual,

12 and the individual being treated or the individual's legal

13 guardian or attorney in fact under Code chapter 144B, relating

14 to a durable power of attorney for health care, has provided

15 informed written consent.

16 The bill may be cited as the "Access to Medical Treatment

17 Act". A physician's treatment of an individual in compliance

18 with the bill shall not by itself constitute unprofessional

19 practice or conduct.

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
