3	A Resolution supporting public policy changes so that
4	substance abuse treatment services have parity with
5	other services provided under public and private
6	health coverage.
7	WHEREAS, addictions to alcohol and other legal and
8	illegal substances are recognized by the American
9	Medical Association as chronic medical conditions just
10	as are asthma, hypertension, and diabetes; and
11	WHEREAS, health insurance benefits for substance
12	abuse treatment do not have parity with the benefits
13	available for treatment of other chronic medical
14	conditions; and
15	WHEREAS, studies show that the treatment approaches
16	used for substance abuse are as effective as, or more
17	effective than, the treatment approaches used for
18	other chronic medical conditions; and
19	WHEREAS, the need to address substance abuse is
20	especially significant to minorities; for example,
21	survey results from 2000 suggest that 6.4 percent of
22	African-Americans age 12 and up used an illegal drug
23	during the previous 30 days, and in 1999, non-Hispanic
24	African-Americans made up 12 percent of the nation's
	general population but accounted for 23 percent of
26	admissions to publicly funded substance abuse
27	treatment facilities; and
28	WHEREAS, research by the Substance Abuse and Mental
	Health Services Administration of the United States
30	Department of Health and Human Services indicates that

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1 requiring comprehensive parity for substance abuse
2 treatment would increase family health insurance
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- 3 premiums by approximately one percent annually; NOW
- 4 THEREFORE,
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES,
- 6 That implementation of comprehensive parity for
- 7 substance abuse treatment is a public policy priority
- 8 for the State of Iowa; and
- 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That comprehensive parity
- 10 should be achieved for private coverage by prohibiting
- 11 individual and group health insurance policies from
- 12 having terms, conditions, or benefit levels that place
- 13 a greater financial burden on an insured for provision
- 14 of substance abuse treatment than for treatment of a
- 15 medical, surgical, or other physical condition; and
- 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That comprehensive parity
- 17 should be achieved for public coverage by prohibiting
- 18 Medicare, Medicaid, and other government-funded or
- 19 government-sponsored health coverage programs from
- 20 having terms, conditions, or benefit levels that place
- 21 a greater financial burden on an insured for provision
- 22 of substance abuse treatment than for treatment of a
- 23 medical, surgical, or other physical condition; and
- 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chief Clerk of the
- 25 House of Representatives shall transmit an official
- 26 copy of this resolution to the President of the United
- 27 States and the members of Iowa's congressional
- 28 delegation.

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
