SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 12 BY BLACK
A Concurrent Resolution supporting the United Nations' recognition of the Republic of China on Taiwan. WHEREAS, the Republic of China was a founding member of the United Nations in 1945, and was consistently faithful to the goals and objectives of the United Nations for 26 years; and WHEREAS, in 1971, the United Nations General Assembly excluded the Republic of China in order to recognize the mainland People's Republic of China; and WHEREAS, the United Nations has allowed other divided countries such as East and West Germany and North and South Korea to be equal members of the United Nations organization; and WHEREAS, on August 6, 1993, seven Central American countries presented an initiative to the Secretary General of the United Nations, calling for the Republic of China's readmission to the United Nations; and

WHEREAS, readmission of the Republic of China would be in keeping with the primary mission of the United Nations of promoting international peace and security; and

WHEREAS, the state of Iowa and several cities in Iowa have established formal sister state and sister city relationships with regions and cities in the Republic of China; and

WHEREAS, the United States and Iowa are significant trading partners as evidenced by the fact that the
