- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 249A.3A APPLICANT INFORMATION
- 2 REQUIRED -- PUBLISHING OF INFORMATION.
- 3 1. An applicant for the medical assistance program shall
- 4 disclose the identity of the employer of the proposed
- 5 beneficiary of health care benefits. If the proposed
- 6 beneficiary is not employed, the applicant shall identify the
- 7 employer of any adult who is responsible for providing support
- 8 to the proposed beneficiary.
- 9 2. On or before January 15, annually, the department of
- 10 human services shall submit a report to the governor and the
- 11 general assembly, identifying all employers identified
- 12 pursuant to subsection 1. The report shall include the name
- 13 of the employer, the location of the employer, and the total
- 14 number of the employer's employees and dependents of employees
- 15 who are enrolled in the medical assistance program. In
- 16 compiling the report, the department shall combine the
- 17 information collected pursuant to section 514I.12 with the
- 18 information collected pursuant to this section. No other
- 19 information regarding program beneficiaries shall be included

- 30 1. An applicant for the hawk-i program shall disclose the
- 31 identity of the employer of the proposed beneficiary of health
- 32 care benefits. If the proposed beneficiary is not employed,
- 33 the applicant shall identify the employer of any adult who is
- 34 responsible for providing support to the proposed beneficiary.
- 35 2. On or before January 15, annually, the department of

- 1 human services shall submit a report to the governor and the
- 2 general assembly, identifying all employers identified

## 19 EXPLANATION

- 20 This bill requires that an applicant for the medical
- 21 assistance program or the hawk-i program disclose the identity
- 22 of the employer of the proposed beneficiary of health care
- 23 benefits. If the proposed beneficiary is not employed, the
- 24 applicant is required to identify the employer of any adult
- 25 who is responsible for providing support to the proposed
- 26 beneficiary.
- 27 The bill directs the department of human services to submit
- 28 a report, on or before January 15, annually, to the governor
- 29 and the general assembly, identifying all employers
- 30 identified, and including the name of the employer, the
- 31 location of the employer, and the total number of the
- 32 employer's employees and dependents of employees who are
- 33 enrolled in the medical assistance or hawk-i program. No
- 34 other information regarding program beneficiaries is to be
- 35 included in the report and the report is to also be made

The bill defines "proposed beneficiary" as an individual 3 who files an application for participation in the medical 4 assistance or hawk-i program for the individual or the person 5 on whose behalf the individual files an application, including 6 but not limited to a child or other dependent of the applicant 7 or other individual for whom the application is filed.
