A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to a single point of entry long=term living resources system.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS == SINGLE POINT OF ENTRY Section 1. 2 LONG=TERM LIVING RESOURCES SYSTEM.
- 1. The general assembly finds that access to information 4 regarding all components of the long=term living resources 5 system is necessary to empower consumers in planning,
 6 evaluating, and making decisions to appropriately meet their
 7 individual long=term living needs. This access should be
 8 provided through a single point of entry into an integrated,
 9 seamless system that facilitates navigation of the variety of 1 10 private and public resources available, minimizes service 11 fragmentation, reduces duplication of administrative paperwork 12 and procedures, enhances individual choice, supports informed 1 13 decision making, and increases the cost=effectiveness of long= 1 14 term living services and support systems.
- 1 15 2. a. A single point of entry long=term living resources 1 16 system team is created, consisting of the following members:
- (1) The director of the department of elder affairs, or 1 18 the director's designee.
- (2) The director of the department of human services, or 1 19 1 20 the director's designee.
 - (3) The director of public health, or the director's 22 designee.
 - (4) The director of the department of inspections and
- 1 24 appeals, or the director's designee. 1 25 (5) The commissioner of insurance, or the commissioner's 26 designee.
- 1 27 (6) The executive director of the Iowa finance authority, 28 or the executive director's designee.
- (7) The director of the department of veterans affairs, or 1 30 the director's designee.
 - (8) The director of the department of workforce 32 development, or the director's designee.
 - (9) A representative of the office of the governor. (10) The director of an area agency on aging or the 35 director's designee and a consumer member selected by the 1 director.
 - The state director of the AARP Iowa chapter or the (11)3 state director's designee and a consumer member selected by 4 the state director.
 - (12) The chairperson of the older Iowans legislature or 6 the chairperson's designee and a consumer member selected by the chairperson.
 - A representative of the Iowa hospital association. (13)
 - (14)A representative of the Iowa pharmacy association.
 - A representative of the Iowa health care association. (15)
- A representative of the Iowa association of community 11 (16)2 12 providers.
 - (17) The director of the university of Iowa center on 13 14 aging, or the director's designee.
- 2 15 (18) Two members of the senate and two members of the 2 16 house of representatives, with not more than one member from
- 2 17 each chamber being from the same political party.

2 18 The legislative members of the team shall serve in an 2 19 ex officio, nonvoting capacity. The two senators shall be 2 20 appointed by the president of the senate, after consultation 21 with the leaders of the senate, and the two representatives 2 22 shall be appointed by the speaker of the house, after 2 23 consultation with the majority leader and the minority leader 24 of the house of representatives.

c. Public members shall receive actual expenses incurred 2 26 while serving in their official capacity and may also be 27 eligible to receive compensation as provided in section 7E.6.

The team shall do all of the following:

(1) Hold at least four public meetings in at least four 30 geographically balanced venues around the state to receive 31 input regarding access to the long=term living resources 32 system and recommendations for improved access.

(2) Make recommendations regarding the structure of and 34 best means of providing a single point of entry to the long=

35 term living resources system.

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(3) Submit a report of the team's findings from the 2 meetings described in subparagraph (1) and the team's recommendations for establishing a single point of entry to 4 the long=term living resources system to the general assembly 5 on or before December 1, 2007. The recommendations may 6 provide for multiple access sites that are standardized and 7 coordinated to provide for access to the single point of 8 entry, a management information system that links the 9 resources available in order to provide a single electronic 3 10 point of entry to the long=term living resources system, a 3 11 telephonic single point of entry, or suggestions for 3 12 colocation or integration of long=term living resources system 3 13 administration and services. The report shall also include 3 14 recommendations for funding the single point of entry to the 3 15 long=term living resources system through available grants or 3 16 other sources.

EXPLANATION

This bill creates a single point of entry long=term living 19 resources system team to develop recommendations regarding the 20 structure of and best means of providing a single point of 3 21 entry to the long=term living resources system. The bill 22 provides for the membership of the team and directs the team 23 to submit a report of its findings from required meetings and 24 its recommendations for establishing a single point of entry 3 25 to a long=term living resources system to the general assembly 26 on or before December 1, 2007. The bill provides that the 27 recommendations may provide for multiple access sites that are 3 28 standardized and coordinated to provide for access to the 29 single point of entry, a management information system that 30 links the resources available in order to provide a single 31 electronic point of entry to the long=term living resources 32 system, a telephonic single point of entry, or suggestions for 33 colocation or integration of long=term living resources system The report is also to include 34 administration and services. 35 recommendations for funding the single point of entry to the 1 long=term living resources system through available grants or 2 other sources. 3 LSB 6486HC 81
