A BILL FOR

1 An Act establishing prelicensing and continuing education

requirements for used motor vehicle dealers.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

4 TLSB 5751SC 81

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Section 1. Section 322.4, Code 2005, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 8A. If the applicant is applying for a 4 used motor vehicle dealer license, certification that the 5 applicant has met the educational requirements for licensure 6 under section 322.7A. The certification may be transmitted to 7 the department by the education provider in electronic format. Sec. 2. Section 322.7, subsection 4, Code 2005, is amended 9 to read as follows:

4. The motor vehicle dealer license provided for in this 1 11 chapter shall be renewed upon application in the form and 1 12 content prescribed by the department and upon payment of the 1 13 required fee. A used motor vehicle dealer license shall not 1 14 be renewed for an applicant who is subject to continuing 15 education requirements until the licensee certifies completion 16 of the educational requirements for license renewal under 17 section 322.7A. The certification may be transmitted to the 18 department by the education provider in electronic format. 1 19 licensee shall have the month of expiration and the month 1 20 after the month of expiration to renew the license. A person 1 21 who fails to renew a license by the end of this time period 1 22 and desires to hold a license shall file a new license

23 application and pay the required fee. 24 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 322.7A USED MOTOR VEHICLE DEALER 1 25 EDUCATION PROGRAM.

26 1. An applicant for a license as a used motor vehicle 27 dealer shall complete a minimum of eight hours of prelicensing 1 28 education program courses pursuant to this section prior to 1 29 submitting an application to the department.

30 2. A person seeking renewal of a used motor vehicle dealer 31 license shall complete a minimum of five hours of continuing 1 32 education program courses over a two=year period pursuant to 33 this section prior to submitting an application for license 34 renewal. However, an applicant for renewal of a used motor 35 vehicle dealer license who has met the prelicensing education 1 requirement under subsection 1 within the preceding twelve 2 months is exempt from the continuing education requirement for 3 license renewal.

3. To meet the requirements of this section, at least one 5 individual who is associated with the used motor vehicle 6 dealer as an owner, principal, corporate officer, director, or 7 member or partner of a limited liability company or limited 8 liability partnership shall complete the education program courses.

4. The Iowa independent auto dealers association shall 11 develop the prelicensing and continuing education course 12 curricula for the used motor vehicle dealer education program, 2 13 which shall include but not be limited to examination of 2 14 federal and state laws applicable to the motor vehicle

2 15 industry and federal, state, and local regulations pertaining

2 16 to used motor vehicle dealers. The education program courses 2 17 shall be provided by an Iowa nonprofit motor vehicle 2 18 association. Costs of the education program shall be borne by 2 19 the course provider, who may charge an applicant a reasonable 2 20 fee of not more than two hundred dollars for the prelicensing 2 21 education course and not more than one hundred fifty dollars 22 for the continuing education course.

- 5. The provisions of this section apply to all used motor 2 24 vehicle dealers, including but not limited to individuals, 25 corporations, and partnerships, except for the following:
- Motor vehicle rental companies having a national a. 2 27 franchise.
 - b. National motor vehicle auction companies.
 - Wholesale dealer=only auction companies.
- c. d. 2 3.0 Used car dealerships owned by a franchise motor vehicle 2 31 dealer.
 - e. Banks, credit unions, and savings and loan 33 associations.
 - 6. A provider of used motor vehicle dealer education 35 program courses shall transmit a report on the program 1 annually by December 31 to the chairpersons of the committees 2 on transportation of the senate and house of representatives.

Sec. 4. USED MOTOR VEHICLE DEALER EDUCATION PROGRAM == CICE. The state department of transportation shall provide 4 NOTICE. 5 reasonable notice to current used motor vehicle dealer 6 licensees of the need to meet continuing education 7 requirements as a condition for future license renewal. EXPLANATION

This bill establishes prelicensing education and continuing 10 education requirements for used motor vehicle dealers. An 3 11 applicant for licensure as a used motor vehicle dealer is 3 12 required to complete at least eight hours of prelicensing 3 13 education prior to licensure, and an applicant for renewal of 3 14 a license is required to complete at least five hours of 3 15 continuing education over a two=year period as a condition for 3 16 license renewal. The bill specifies those persons associated 3 17 with a dealer in an official capacity who can fulfill the 3 18 education requirements on behalf of the dealer. The education 3 19 requirements do not apply to nationally franchised rental 3 20 companies; national motor vehicle and wholesale dealer=only 21 auction companies; used car dealerships owned by a franchise 22 motor vehicle dealer; and banks, credit unions, and savings 3 23 and loan associations.

2.4 The bill requires the Iowa independent automobile dealers 25 association to develop course curricula for the education 3 26 program, and specifies that a provider of the program courses 27 shall be an Iowa nonprofit motor vehicle association. Costs 3 28 of the education program are the responsibility of the course 3 29 provider, and may be recouped by fees of up to \$200 for 3 30 prelicensing courses and \$150 for continuing education 31 courses. An education course provider is required to report 32 annually to the chairpersons of the transportation committees 3 33 of the senate and house of representatives.

The state department of transportation is directed to 35 provide timely notice of the new requirements to current 1 licensees.

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
