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 Section 1. Section 256.7, subsection 21, paragraph b, Code
 Supplement 2007, is amended to read as follows:
 b. A set of core academic indicators in mathematics and 4 reading in grades four, eight, and eleven, a set of core 5 academic indicators in science in grades eight and eleven, and 6 another set of core indicators that includes, but is not 1 7 limited to, <u>data from the assessments administered pursuant t</u> 1 8 subsection 29, graduation rate, postsecondary education, and 1 9 successful employment in Iowa. Annually, the department shall 1 10 report state data for each indicator in the condition of 1 11 education report. 1 12 Sec. 2. Section 256.7, subsection 28, Code Supplement 1 13 2007, is amended to read as follows: 28. <u>a. (1)</u> Adopt a set of <u>by rule, for implementation by</u> <u>y 1, 2010</u>, core content <u>and performance</u> standards 1 14 1<u>5 July 1,</u> 1 16 applicable to all students in kindergarten through grade 1 17 twelve in every school district and accredited nonpublic 1 18 school. The board shall consider the recommendations of the 19 task force convened by the director in accordance with 20 subparagraph (2). The board shall establish criteria to 21 ensure that the standards adopted are rigorous and support 22 best practices. However, the standards adopted shall not 23 exceed in scope or depth the curriculum that can be reasonably 24 taught in the instructional time available. Prior to 25 adoption, the board shall submit the proposed standards to an 26 external, nonprofit educational organization for an 27 independent review. The results of the review shall be posted 29 (2) Recommended core content and performance standards 30 shall be developed by a task force convened by the director of 31 the department. The task force shall be comprised of 32 teachers, school administrators, higher education faculty who 33 teach in the subjects for which the standards are being <u>34 adopted, private sector employers, and members of the boards</u> <u>35 of directors of school districts. The task force shall review</u> 1 the national assessment of educational progress standards and 2 standards adopted by other states. The task force may be reconvened whenever the <u>11 director of the department determines there is a need to</u> 12 review or amend the core content and performance standards. 2 13 <u>b.</u> For purposes of this subsection, "core content 2 14 standards" includes The core content standards for 15 kindergarten through grade six shall include reading and 2 16 writing, mathematics, and science, while the core content 2 17 standards for grades seven through twelve shall include 2 18 English and language arts, mathematics, science, history and 2 19 social studies, and art. The core content standards shall be 19 social studies, and art.

The board shall 3 19 require school districts to administer the assessments to 3 20 students in grades four, eight, and eleven. Where possible, 3 21 the assessments shall be psychometrically equated to 3 22 proficiency on the national assessment for educational 3 23 progress. The assessment results shall be reported annually 3 24 to the department and the local community in accordance with 3 25 subsection 21. 3 26 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 30. Adopt assessments which the board 3 27 shall require school districts to administer to students at 3 28 the end of each unit of algebra, advanced algebra, geometry,

Section 256.9, Code Supplement 2007, is amended by 3 3 33 34 adding the following new subsection: 35 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 57. Develop and deliver, in collaboration 1 with the institutions of higher education governed by the 3 3 4 4 2 state board of regents and the area education agencies, 4 3 subject matter and grade=level specific training for teachers 4 and administrators in standards=based curriculum development 4 and standards=based instruction. 4 5 STATE MANDATE FUNDING SPECIFIED. In accordance 4 6 Sec. 5. with section 25B.2, subsection 3, the state cost of requiring compliance with any state mandate included in this Act shall be paid by a school district from state school foundation aid 4 7 4 8 9 4 10 received by the school district under section 257.16. This 11 specification of the payment of the state cost shall be deemed 4 4 4 12 to meet all of the state funding=related requirements of 4 13 section 25B.2, subsection 3, and no additional state funding 4 14 shall be necessary for the full implementation of this Act by 4 15 and enforcement of this Act against all affected school 4 16 districts. 4 17 EXPLANATION This bill requires the state board of education to adopt by 18 4 4 19 rule core content and performance standards for implementation 4 20 by July 1, 2010; requires the board to adopt assessments for 4 21 grade levels and subject areas; and requires school districts 4 22 to incorporate the standards and administer the assessments. 4 23 The bill expands on the core content standards requirements 24 already established in the Code by providing that the content 25 standards for kindergarten through grade six must include 4 4 4 26 reading and writing, mathematics, and science, while the 27 standards for grades seven through 12 must include English and 4 4 28 language arts, mathematics, science, history and social 4 29 studies, and art. The board must establish criteria to ensure 4 30 that the standards are rigorous and support best practices,

4 31 but the standards are not to exceed in scope or depth the 4 32 curriculum which may be reasonably taught in the instructional 4 33 time available. The performance standards, or grade=level expectations, 4 34 4 35 must be aligned to the core content standards and must specify 5 what all students should know and be able to do at the end of 1 5 2 a given grade level. 5 Recommended core content and performance standards are to 3 5 4 be developed by a task force convened by the director of the 5 department of education and consisting of representatives from 5 5 6 education and business. The task force shall review national 7 standards and standards adopted by other states and submit 5 5 8 recommended standards to the state board by January 2, 2009. 5 9 Prior to adoption, the board must submit the proposed 5 10 standards to an external organization for an independent 5 11 review, the results of which shall be posted on the 5 12 department's web site. Each school district must align the local curriculum, 5 13 5 14 instructional materials, and classroom instruction to the 5 15 standards and submit evidence of such alignment satisfactory 16 to the department. School districts must administer grade= 5 5 17 level assessments at a minimum at grades four, eight, and 11. 5 18 Students cannot be denied curriculum and instruction 5 19 consistent with the standards. The results must be submitted 5 20 annually with the core academic indicator data required under 5 21 Code section 256.7, subsection 21. 5 22 The state board must also adopt assessments which the board 5 23 shall require school districts to administer to students at 5 24 the end of each unit of algebra, advanced algebra, geometry, 5 25 biology, chemistry, physics, and fourth=year English. The 5 26 student may substitute an advanced placement examination. 5 27 results must be placed in the student's permanent record. The 5 28 The bill also requires the department to develop and 5 29 deliver, in collaboration with the regents universities and 5 30 area education agencies, subject matter and grade=level 5 31 specific training for teachers and administrators in 5 32 standards=based curriculum development and standards=based 5 33 instruction. 5 The bill makes conforming changes by providing that a set 34 5 35 of core academic indicators required currently must include б 1 data from the assessments administered in accordance with the 2 bill in a report to the department. б 3 The bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code 4 section 25B.3. The bill requires that the state cost of any 6 6 6 5 state mandate included in the bill be paid by a school 6 6 district from state school foundation aid received by the б 7 school district under Code section 257.16.
