A commercial, public, or private applicator is not required to be certified to apply pesticides for a period of twenty-one one hundred twenty days from the date of initial employment if the commercial, public, or private applicator is under the direct immediate supervision of a certified applicator. For the purposes of this section subsection, "under the direct supervision of" immediate supervision" means that the application of a pesticide is made by a competent person acting under the instructions and control of a certified applicator who is physically present, by being in sight or hearing distance of the supervised person.  Sec. 2. Section 206.5, subsection 4, Code 2007, is amended to read as follows:  4. A commercial applicator who applies pesticides to agricultural land may, in lieu of the requirement of direct immediate supervision in subsection 3, elect to be exempt from the certification requirements for a commercial applicator for a period of twenty-one days, if the applicator meets the requirements of a private applicator.  EXPLANATION  This bill amends Code chapter 206, the "Pesticide Act of Iowa". The term "pesticide" is defined broadly to include any substance intended to prevent, destroy, repel, or mitigate insects, rodents, nemacodes, fungi, or weeds. Code section (commercial applicators), persons who apply pesticides on public land (public applicators), and persons who apply 1 pesticides on public land (public applicators), and persons who apply pesticides on public land (public, or private applicator must be certified by passing an examination, and recertified by passing an examination, and recertified by passing an examination or completing continuing instructional courses. However, a commercial, public, or private applicator is not required to be certified to apply pesticides for a period of 21 days if the applicator (within sight or hearing distance). The bill amends Code section 206.5 to extend the period of time when the exception applies from 21
