A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the use of headlamps when a motor
- vehicle's windshield wipers are in use and making a penalty
- 3 applicable.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 321.235A, subsection 3, Code 2009, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 A person shall not operate an electric personal assistive
- 4 mobility device at the times specified in section 321.384,
- 5 subsection 1 unless the person or the electric personal
- 6 assistive mobility device is equipped with a headlight visible
- 7 from the front of the electric personal assistive mobility
- 8 device and at least one red reflector visible from the rear of
- 9 the electric personal assistive mobility device.
- 10 Sec. 2. Section 321.384, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 11 follows:
- 321.384 When lighted lamps required.
- 13 l. a. Every A motor vehicle upon operated on a highway
- 14 within the state, shall display lighted headlamps as provided
- 15 in section 321.415 at any time from sunset to sunrise, and at
- 16 such other times when conditions such as fog, snow, sleet,
- 17 or rain provide insufficient lighting to render clearly
- 18 discernible persons and vehicles on the highway at a distance
- 19 of five hundred feet ahead, shall display lighted headlamps as
- 20 provided in section 321.415, subject to exceptions under this
- 21 chapter with respect to parked vehicles as hereinafter stated.
- 22 2. b. Whenever A requirement is hereinafter declared
- 23 as to regarding the distance from which certain lamps and
- 24 devices shall render objects visible or within which such
- 25 lamps or devices shall be visible, said provisions shall
- 26 apply applies during the times stated in subsection 1 of this
- 27 section upon paragraph "a", on a straight, level, unlighted
- 28 highway under normal atmospheric conditions unless a different
- 29 time or condition is expressly stated.
- 30 2. A motor vehicle operated on a highway shall display
- 31 lighted headlamps as provided in section 321.415 at any
- 32 time the motor vehicle's windshield wipers are in continuous
- 33 operation, subject to exceptions under this chapter with
- 34 respect to parked vehicles. This subsection does not apply to
- 35 a motor vehicle equipped with alternate road-lighting equipment

- 1 as described in section 321.418.
- 2 Sec. 3. Section 321.392, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2009,
- 3 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 Every motor truck, and every trailer or semitrailer of over
- 5 three thousand pounds gross weight, shall be equipped with the
- 6 following lighting devices and reflectors in addition to other
- 7 requirements of this chapter, and such devices shall be lighted
- 8 at the times mentioned in section 321.384, subsection 1.
- 9 Sec. 4. Section 321.394, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 10 follows:
- 11 321.394 Lamp or flag on projecting load.
- 12 Whenever the load upon any vehicle extends to the rear four
- 13 feet or more beyond the bed or body of such vehicle there
- 14 shall be displayed at the extreme rear end of the load, at the
- 15 times specified in section 321.384, subsection 1, a red light
- 16 or lantern plainly visible from a distance of at least five
- 17 hundred feet to the sides and rear. The red light or lantern
- 18 required under this section shall be in addition to the red
- 19 rear light required upon every vehicle. At any other time
- 20 there shall be displayed at the extreme rear end of such load a
- 21 red flag or cloth not less than sixteen inches square.
- Sec. 5. Section 321.395, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 23 follows:
- 24 321.395 Lamps on parked vehicles.
- 25 Whenever a vehicle is parked or stopped upon a roadway
- 26 or shoulder adjacent to the roadway, outside of a business
- 27 district whether attended or unattended during the times
- 28 mentioned in section 321.384, subsection 1, such vehicle shall
- 29 be equipped with one or more lamps which shall exhibit a white
- 30 or amber light on the roadway side visible from a distance
- 31 of five hundred feet to the front of such vehicle and a red
- 32 light visible from a distance of five hundred feet to the
- 33 rear, except that local authorities may provide by ordinance
- 34 or resolution that no lights need be displayed upon any such
- 35 vehicle when stopped or parked in accordance with local parking

- 1 regulations upon a highway where there is sufficient light to
- 2 reveal any person or object within a distance of five hundred
- 3 feet upon such highway. Any lighted headlamps upon a parked
- 4 vehicle shall be depressed or dimmed.
- 5 Sec. 6. Section 321.397, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 321.397 Lamps on bicycles.
- 8 Every bicycle shall be equipped with a lamp on the front
- 9 exhibiting a white light, at the times specified in section
- 10 321.384, subsection 1, visible from a distance of at least
- 11 three hundred feet to the front and with a lamp on the rear
- 12 exhibiting a red light visible from a distance of three hundred
- 13 feet to the rear; except that a red reflector may be used in
- 14 lieu of a rear light. A peace officer riding a police bicycle
- 15 is not required to use either front or rear lamps if duty so
- 16 requires.
- 17 Sec. 7. Section 321.398, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 18 follows:
- 19 321.398 Lamps on other vehicles and equipment.
- 20 All vehicles, including animal-drawn vehicles and including
- 21 those referred to in section 321.383 not hereinbefore
- 22 specifically required to be equipped with lamps, shall at the
- 23 times specified in section 321.384, subsection 1, be equipped
- 24 with at least one lighted lamp or lantern exhibiting a white
- 25 light visible from a distance of five hundred feet to the front
- 26 of such vehicle and, except for animal-drawn vehicles, with a
- 27 lamp or lantern exhibiting a red light visible from a distance
- 28 of five hundred feet to the rear. Animal-drawn vehicles shall
- 29 be equipped with a flashing amber light visible from a distance
- 30 of five hundred feet to the rear of the vehicle during the time
- 31 specified in section 321.384, subsection 1.
- Sec. 8. Section 321.405, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 33 follows:
- 34 321.405 Self-illumination.
- 35 All mechanical signal devices shall be self-illuminated when

- 1 in use at the times mentioned in section 321.384, subsection 1.
- 2 Sec. 9. Section 321.418, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 321.418 Alternate road-lighting equipment.
- 5 Any motor vehicle may be operated under the conditions
- 6 specified in section 321.384, subsection 1, when equipped with
- 7 two lighted lamps upon the front thereof capable of revealing
- 8 persons and objects seventy-five feet ahead in lieu of lamps
- 9 required in sections 321.409 and 321.415, or section 321.417,
- 10 provided, however, that at no time shall it be operated at a
- 11 speed in excess of twenty miles per hour.
- 12 EXPLANATION
- 13 This bill amends Code section 321.384 to require that a
- 14 motor vehicle's headlamps be lighted at any time when the motor
- 15 vehicle's windshield wipers are in continuous operation. The
- 16 requirement is an addition to current law, which requires
- 17 lighted headlamps from sunset to sunrise and when conditions
- 18 such as fog, snow, sleet, or rain provide insufficient lighting
- 19 to clearly see 500 feet ahead.
- 20 Because several existing Code sections refer to the times
- 21 specified in Code section 321.384, the bill makes conforming
- 22 amendments to limit the scope of the new requirement. As a
- 23 result, the bill does not affect current provisions relating
- 24 to the use of lighting on personal assistive mobility devices,
- 25 bicycles, animal-drawn vehicles, parked vehicles, slow-moving
- 26 vehicles, motor vehicles equipped with alternate road-lighting
- 27 equipment, and implements of husbandry; the use of clearance
- 28 and identification lights on motor trucks, trailers, and
- 29 semitrailers; the use of lamps or flags on projecting loads; or
- 30 the use of self-illuminated signal devices.
- 31 Pursuant to current law, a violation of motor vehicle
- 32 headlamp requirements is a simple misdemeanor punishable by a
- 33 scheduled fine of \$20.
