A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the accreditation of nonpublic schools.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 256.11, Code Supplement 2009, is amended
- 2 by adding the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 16. a. Notwithstanding subsections
- 4 1 through 12, there is established an alternative to the
- 5 accreditation of nonpublic schools by the state board. The
- 6 state board shall maintain a list of approved alternative
- 7 accrediting agencies comprised of at least six regional or
- 8 national nonprofit, nongovernmental agencies recognized in the
- 9 education community as reliable authorities concerning the
- 10 quality of education offered by a school and shall publish the
- 11 list of alternative accrediting agencies on the department's
- 12 internet site.
- 13 b. A nonprofit school that participates in the accreditation
- 14 process offered by an alternative accrediting agency on
- 15 the approved list published pursuant to paragraph "a" shall
- 16 be deemed to meet the education standards of this section.
- 17 However, such a school shall comply with statutory health and
- 18 safety requirements for students and school personnel, and
- 19 school facilities.
- 20 c. If the state board takes preliminary action to remove
- 21 an agency from the approved list published on the department's
- 22 internet site pursuant to paragraph "a", the department
- 23 shall, at least one year prior to removing the agency from
- 24 the approved list, notify the nonpublic schools participating
- 25 in the accreditation process offered by the agency of the
- 26 state board's intent to remove the accrediting agency from its
- 27 approved list of alternative accrediting agencies. The notice
- 28 shall also contain the proposed date of removal. The nonpublic
- 29 school shall attain accreditation under this subsection or
- 30 subsections 1 through 12 not later than one year following the
- 31 date on which the state board removes the agency from its list
- 32 of alternative accrediting agencies.
- 33 EXPLANATION
- 34 This bill establishes an alternative to the accreditation of
- 35 nonpublic schools by the state board of education by requiring

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1 the state board to maintain a list of approved alternative 2 accrediting agencies comprised of at least six regional or 3 national nonprofit, nongovernmental agencies recognized in the 4 education community as reliable authorities concerning the 5 quality of education offered by a school and to publish the 6 list of alternative accrediting agencies on the department's 7 internet site. A nonprofit school that participates in the 8 accreditation process offered by an alternative accrediting 9 agency on the list published by the state board shall be 10 deemed to meet the education standards of Code section 256.11. 11 However, such a school shall comply with statutory health and 12 safety requirements for students and school personnel, and 13 school facilities. 14 If the state board takes preliminary action to remove an 15 agency from its list of approved accrediting agencies, the 16 department shall notify the nonpublic schools accredited 17 through the alternative process of the state board's intent 18 to remove the accrediting agency from its approved list at 19 least one year prior to removing the agency from the approved 20 list, and the nonpublic school shall attain accreditation not

21 later than one year following the date on which the state
