## A BILL FOR

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7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS. There is 2 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the 3 department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year beginning 4 July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the following amounts, 5 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes 6 designated: 1. ADMINISTRATION 7 8 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, 9 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent 10 positions for the department: 11 ..... \$ 212,069 12 ..... FTEs 74.50 The department of cultural affairs shall coordinate 13 14 activities with the tourism office of the department of 15 economic development to promote attendance at the state 16 historical building and at this state's historic sites. 17 Full-time equivalent positions authorized under this 18 subsection shall be funded, in full or in part, using moneys 19 appropriated under this subsection and subsections 3 through 7. 20 2. COMMUNITY CULTURAL GRANTS 21 For planning and programming for the community cultural 22 grants program established under section 303.3: 23 ..... \$ 273,500 24 3. HISTORICAL DIVISION 25 For the support of the historical division: 26 ..... \$ 3,195,107 27 4. HISTORIC SITES For the administration and support of historic sites: 28 29 ..... \$ 493,060 5. RECORDS CENTER RENT 4 For payment of rent for the state records center: 5 6 ..... \$ 227,243 Sec. 2. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY - ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. 7 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, the goals for 8 9 the department of economic development shall be to expand and 10 stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and 11 increase the population of the state. 12 2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the department 13 of economic development shall do all of the following for the 14 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010: 15 a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that 16 result in commercially viable products and services. 17 b. Adopt practices and services consistent with free 18 market, private sector philosophies. 19 c. Ensure economic growth and development throughout the 20 state. Sec. 3. DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. 21 There is 22 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the 23 department of economic development for the fiscal year 24 beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the following 25 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the 26 purposes designated: 1. ADMINISTRATION DIVISION 27 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous 28 29 purposes, and programs; for transfer to the Iowa state 30 commission grant program; and for not more than the following 31 full-time equivalent positions for the department's three 32 divisions: 33 .....\$ 1,976,046 34 ..... FTEs 149.00 b. The department shall work with businesses and 35

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1 communities to continually improve the economic development 2 climate along with the economic well-being and quality of life 3 for Iowans. The administration division shall coordinate with 4 other state agencies to ensure that all state departments are 5 attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture.

6 c. Full-time equivalent positions authorized under this 7 subsection shall be funded, in full or in part, using moneys 8 appropriated under this subsection and subsections 2 and 3 9 and by certain federal moneys or other moneys received by the 10 department.

11 d. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in 12 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the 13 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain 14 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the 15 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

16 2. BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT DIVISION

b. The department shall establish a strong and aggressive
marketing image to showcase Iowa's workforce, existing
industry, and potential. A priority shall be placed on
recruiting new businesses, business expansion, and retaining
existing Iowa businesses. Emphasis shall also be placed on
entrepreneurial development through helping to secure capital
for entrepreneurs, and developing networks and a business
climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small business.

31 c. A business creating jobs with economic development 32 assistance through moneys appropriated in this subsection shall 33 be subject to contract provisions stating that new and retained 34 jobs shall be filled by individuals who are citizens of the 35 United States who reside within the United States or any person

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1 authorized to work in the United States pursuant to federal 2 law, including legal resident aliens in the United States. Any 3 vendor who receives such public moneys shall adhere to such 4 contract provisions and provide periodic assurances as the 5 state shall require that the jobs are filled solely by citizens 6 of the United States who reside within the United States or 7 any person authorized to work in the United States pursuant 8 to federal law, including legal resident aliens in the United 9 States. A business that receives financial assistance from 10 the department from moneys appropriated in this bill shall 11 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this 12 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided 13 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received 14 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals 15 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to 16 recapture by the department.

17 d. From the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the 18 department may provide financial assistance in the form of a 19 grant to a community economic development entity for conducting 20 a local workforce recruitment effort designed to recruit former 21 citizens of the state and former students at colleges and 22 universities in the state to meet the needs of local employers. 23 From the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the e. 24 department may provide financial assistance to early-stage 25 industry companies being established by women entrepreneurs. 26 From the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the f. 27 department may provide financial assistance in the form of 28 grants, loans, or forgivable loans for advanced research and 29 commercialization projects involving value-added agriculture, 30 advanced technology, or biotechnology.

31 g. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in 32 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the 33 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain 34 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the 35 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

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1 3. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIVISION

9 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this 10 subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close 11 of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available 12 for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of 13 the succeeding fiscal year.

14 Sec. 4. VISION IOWA PROGRAM — FTE AUTHORIZATION. For 15 purposes of administrative duties associated with the vision 16 Iowa program, the department of economic development is 17 authorized an additional 2.25 FTEs above those otherwise 18 authorized in this Act.

19 Sec. 5. INSURANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. From the moneys 20 collected by the division of insurance in excess of the 21 anticipated gross revenues under section 505.7, subsection 3, 22 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, \$100,000 shall 23 be transferred to the department of economic development for 24 insurance economic development and international insurance 25 economic development.

IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY. 24 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state 1. 25 to Iowa state university of science and technology for the 26 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, 27 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to 28 be used for small business development centers, the science 29 and technology research park, and the institute for physical 30 research and technology, and for not more than the following 31 full-time equivalent positions: 32 ..... 2,575,983 \$ 33 ..... FTEs 56.63 34 2. Of the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, Iowa state 35 university of science and technology shall allocate at least

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1 \$1,076,234 for purposes of funding small business development 2 centers. 4. 12 It is the intent of the general assembly that the 13 industrial incentive program focus on Iowa industrial 14 sectors and seek contributions and in-kind donations from 15 businesses, industrial foundations, and trade associations, 16 and that moneys for the institute for physical research and 17 technology industrial incentive program shall be allocated 18 only for projects which are matched by private sector moneys 19 for directed contract research or for nondirected research. 20 The match required of small businesses as defined in section 21 15.102, subsection 6, for directed contract research or for 22 nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$3 of state funds. 23 The match required for other businesses for directed contract 24 research or for nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$1 of 25 state funds. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD. 6 There is 7 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the public 8 employment relations board for the fiscal year beginning July 9 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the following amount, or so 10 much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated: For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, 11 12 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent 13 positions: 14 .....\$ 1,101,903 10.00 15 ..... FTEs Of the moneys appropriated in this section, the board 16 17 shall allocate \$15,000 for maintaining a website that allows 18 searchable access to a database of collective bargaining 19 information. 20 Sec. 21. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY AUDIT. The auditor of state 21 is requested to review the audit of the Iowa finance authority 22 performed by the auditor hired by the authority. Sec. 22. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAM. Notwithstanding 23 24 section 96.9, subsection 4, paragraph "a", moneys credited to 25 the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United 26 States pursuant to section 903 of the Social Security 27 Act are appropriated to the department of workforce 28 development and shall be used by the department for the 29 administration of the unemployment compensation program only. 30 This appropriation shall not apply to any fiscal year 31 beginning after December 31, 2009. Sec. 23. 2009 Iowa Acts, chapter 176, section 3, subsection 32 33 5, is amended to read as follows: 34 5. Sec. 24. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. The section of this Act 8 9 amending 2009 Iowa Acts, chapter 176, being deemed of immediate 10 importance, takes effect upon enactment. EXPLANATION 11 12 This bill makes appropriations and transfers from the 13 general fund of the state and other funds to the department 14 of cultural affairs, the department of economic development, 15 the university of Iowa, the university of northern Iowa, Iowa 16 state university, the department of workforce development, and 17 the public employment relations board for the 2010-2011 fiscal 18 year. 19 The bill provides that the goals for the department of 20 economic development shall be to expand and stimulate the 21 state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and increase the 22 population of the state. 23 The bill transfers moneys collected by the division of 24 insurance in excess of the anticipated gross revenues to the 25 department of economic development for purposes of insurance 26 economic development and international insurance economic 27 development. The bill appropriates moneys from the Iowa community 28 29 development loan fund to the department of economic development 30 for purposes of the community development program. The bill appropriates moneys from the workforce development 31 32 fund account to the workforce development fund. 33 The bill provides that moneys appropriated or transferred 34 to or receipts credited to the workforce development fund are 35 appropriated to the department of economic development for

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1 administration of workforce development activities.

2 The bill provides that all moneys in the job training fund on 3 July 1, 2010, and any moneys appropriated or credited to the 4 fund during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, shall be 5 transferred to the workforce development fund.

6 The bill requires the state board of regents to submit a 7 report on the progress of regents institutions in meeting 8 the strategic plan for technology transfer and economic 9 development.

10 The bill requires the auditor of state to conduct an audit of 11 the department of workforce development.

12 The bill appropriates moneys from the special employment 13 security contingency fund to the department of workforce 14 development for the division of workers' compensation and for 15 the operation of field offices.

16 The bill appropriates interest earned on the unemployment 17 compensation reserve fund to the department of workforce 18 development for the operation of field offices.

19 The bill appropriates moneys to the department of workforce 20 development for an employee misclassification program.

The bill requests the auditor of state to review the audit of the Iowa finance authority performed by the auditor hired by the authority.

The bill appropriates moneys from moneys credited to the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United States pursuant to the Social Security Act to the department of workforce development for the administration of the unemployment compensation program only.

The bill provides for the filing of surety bonds or qualified 30 statements by out-of-state contractors with the division of 31 labor services.

32 The bill amends 2009 Iowa Acts, chapter 176, to provide for 33 the nonrevision of moneys appropriated for purposes of matching 34 funds for main street challenge grants. The section amending 35 the 2009 Iowa Acts is effective upon enactment.

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
