14	immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
15	Sec. 7. RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY. This Act applies
16	retroactively to July 1, 2010.
17	EXPLANATION
18	This bill reduces appropriations for FY 2010-2011 under the
19	purview of the department of human services and the department
20	of public health.
21	The bill directs that the allocation to the Iowa
22	collaborative safety net provider network for allocation to
23	Iowa family planning network agencies under the community
24	capacity appropriation to the department of public health is to
25	be reduced by the amount allocated to any entity that provides
26	abortions in the state.
27	The bill reduces the appropriations to the department of
28	human services for medical assistance and for child and family
29	services and the department is directed to implement the
30	reduction by reducing the amount paid by the department to any
31	entity that provides abortions in the state.
32	The bill takes effect upon enactment and is retroactively
33	applicable to July 1, 2010.
