A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act requiring that certain housing constructed using public
- 2 funds incorporate minimum universal design standards
- 3 relating to accessibility.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 104A.3 Minimum universal design
 standards — accessibility.

3 1. Findings. The general assembly finds and declares 4 it is the policy of this state to encourage the design and 5 construction of affordable homes and apartments that people 6 of all ages and abilities can independently access, enter, 7 and visit. Incorporating universal design features into new 8 construction dramatically reduces the need to make and pay 9 for home modifications that address accessibility and use 10 restrictions related to aging and temporary or long-term 11 injury, illness, or disability.

12 2. *Definitions.* For purposes of this section, unless the 13 context otherwise requires:

14 a. "New construction" means housing that is being 15 constructed on-site and did not previously exist in residential 16 or nonresidential form. "New construction" does not include the 17 alteration, renovation, or remodeling of an existing structure. 18 b. "Publicly financed housing" includes any single-family 19 home, townhouse, duplex, and any other building with three or 20 fewer dwelling units constructed in whole or in part using 21 public funding or assistance provided by or through the state 22 or any political subdivision of the state.

23 3. Standards.

a. All new construction of publicly financed housing shall
incorporate minimum universal design standards in its design
and construction.

b. The state building code commissioner shall, after consultation with the Iowa finance authority, the Iowa department of economic development, the Iowa civil rights commission, the department on aging, representatives of the homebuilding industry, and advocates for persons with disabilities, adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 17A, to setablish minimum universal design standards. The rules shall address, at a minimum, the following subjects:

35 (1) Accessible entrances, doorways, and hallways. At least

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1 one entrance shall be accessible and on an accessible route
2 into and through the dwelling.

3 (2) Accessible and adaptable bathrooms. At least one4 bathroom shall be accessible and adaptable.

5 (3) Accessible electrical, light, and environmental6 controls.

7 (4) Provisions to allow elements of the minimum universal 8 design standards to be waived for a specific project if 9 strict compliance is determined to be prohibitively costly 10 or technically infeasible. The state agency or political 11 subdivision administering or providing the public funds shall 12 make such determinations and shall report such determinations 13 to the building code commissioner.

4. Enforcement. The entity by or through which the
public funding or assistance for publicly financed housing is
administered shall enforce the requirements of this section.
This section shall not be construed to require the department
of public safety to engage in enforcement activities.

19 5. Applicability. The requirements of this section shall 20 apply to any publicly financed housing for which a building 21 permit is requested on or after July 1, 2012.

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EXPLANATION

This bill requires the state building code commissioner to adopt by rule minimum universal design standards relating to accessibility and applicable to publicly financed housing. Publicly financed housing is defined as any single-family home, townhouse, duplex, and any other building with three or fewer dwelling units constructed in whole or in part with public glunds.

The bill provides that the design standards shall apply to new construction of publicly financed housing for which a building permit is requested on or after July 1, 2012. The bill requires the state building code commissioner to to consult with the Iowa finance authority, the Iowa department of economic development, the Iowa civil rights commission,

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LSB 1938XS (2) 84 aw/sc 1 the department on aging, representatives of the homebuilding 2 industry, and advocates for persons with disabilities prior to 3 adopting rules. The bill further provides that the universal 4 design standards shall address accessible entrances, doorways, 5 hallways, bathrooms, and environmental controls, and shall 6 include a waiver provision.

7 The bill provides that enforcement of the bill shall be by 8 the public entity providing the public funds for the housing.

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
