A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing a school tuition credit for certain pupils
- 2 attending an accredited nonpublic school and including
- 3 applicability provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 256.7, Code 2011, is amended by adding
- 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 31. Adopt rules relating to applications
- 4 for a school tuition credit pursuant to section 257.11B,
- 5 including application processing timelines, required
- 6 information for submission by a parent or quardian, and
- 7 penalties for noncompliance.
- 8 Sec. 2. Section 257.6, subsection 1, paragraph a,
- 9 unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 10 follows:
- 11 Actual Except as provided in subparagraph (8), actual
- 12 enrollment is determined annually on October 1, or the first
- 13 Monday in October if October 1 falls on a Saturday or Sunday,
- 14 and includes all of the following:
- 15 Sec. 3. Section 257.6, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code 2011,
- 16 is amended by adding the following new subparagraph:
- 17 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (8) Resident pupils receiving a school
- 18 tuition credit pursuant to section 257.11B, as designated by
- 19 March 1.
- 20 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 257.11B School tuition credits.
- 21 1. Pupils attending an accredited nonpublic school shall be
- 22 eligible to receive a school tuition credit for attendance in
- 23 the following grades according to the following schedule:
- 24 a. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2012, pupils
- 25 in kindergarten.
- 26 b. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2013, pupils
- 27 in kindergarten and grade one.
- 28 c. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2014, pupils
- 29 in kindergarten and grades one and two.
- 30 d. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2015, pupils
- 31 in kindergarten and grades one through three.
- 32 e. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2016, pupils
- 33 in kindergarten and grades one through four.
- 34 f. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2017, pupils
- 35 in kindergarten and grades one through five.

- 1 g. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2018, pupils
- 2 in kindergarten and grades one through six.
- 3 h. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2019, pupils
- 4 in kindergarten and grades one through seven.
- i. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2020, pupils
- 6 in kindergarten and grades one through eight.
- 7 j. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2021, pupils
- 8 in kindergarten and grades one through nine.
- 9 k. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2022, pupils
- 10 in kindergarten and grades one through ten.
- II I. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2023, pupils
- 12 in kindergarten and grades one through eleven.
- m. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2024, and
- 14 succeeding budget years, pupils in kindergarten and grades one
- 15 through twelve.
- 16 2. a. By January of the school year preceding the school
- 17 year for which the school tuition credit is requested, the
- 18 parent or quardian of the pupil requesting to receive a school
- 19 tuition credit shall submit an application to the department
- 20 of education, on forms to be developed by the department,
- 21 indicating that the parent or guardian intends to enroll the
- 22 pupil in an accredited nonpublic school.
- 23 b. By March 1, the department of education shall notify the
- 24 department of management of the number of pupils designated to
- 25 receive school tuition credits.
- 26 3. a. (1) The department of management shall assign each
- 27 designated pupil a school tuition credit in an amount equal to
- 28 thirty-five percent of the regular program foundation base per
- 29 pupil, as defined in section 257.1, subsection 2, paragraph "b".
- 30 (2) The department of education, in consultation with
- 31 the department of management, shall reduce the state aid
- 32 payments to a local public school district otherwise payable
- 33 pursuant to section 257.16 for the following school budget year
- 34 attributable to the designated pupils by sixty-five percent of
- 35 the regular program foundation base per pupil, as defined in

- 1 section 257.1, subsection 2, paragraph "b". The regular program
- 2 foundation funds not paid to school districts due to the school
- 3 tuition credit reduction shall remain in the general fund of
- 4 the state.
- 5 (3) A public school district shall transfer twenty-five
- 6 percent of the regular program foundation base per pupil,
- 7 as defined in section 257.1, subsection 2, paragraph "b",
- 8 per designated pupil directly to the applicable accredited
- 9 nonpublic school and shall retain the remaining ten percent
- 10 of the regular program foundation base per pupil, as defined
- 11 in section 257.1, subsection 2, paragraph "b", as the pupil's
- 12 district of residence.
- 13 b. (1) Commencing in the school budget year beginning
- 14 July 1, 2024, and succeeding budget years, if the average
- 15 enrollment at an accredited nonpublic school equals seventeen
- 16 percent of the combined enrollment of the local public school
- 17 district and the accredited nonpublic school, the department of
- 18 management shall assign each designated pupil a school tuition
- 19 credit in an amount equal to forty-five percent of the regular
- 20 program foundation base per pupil, as defined in section 257.1,
- 21 subsection 2, paragraph "b".
- 22 (2) The department of education, in consultation with
- 23 the department of management, shall reduce the state aid
- 24 payments to a local public school district otherwise payable
- 25 pursuant to section 257.16 for the following school budget year
- 26 attributable to the designated pupils by fifty-five percent of
- 27 the regular program foundation base per pupil, as defined in
- 28 section 257.1, subsection 2, paragraph "b". The regular program
- 29 foundation funds not paid to school districts due to the school
- 30 tuition credit reduction shall remain in the general fund of
- 31 the state.
- 32 (3) A public school district shall transfer thirty percent
- 33 of the regular program foundation base per pupil, as defined
- 34 in section 257.1, subsection 2, paragraph "b", per designated
- 35 pupil directly to the applicable accredited nonpublic school

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- 1 and shall retain the remaining fifteen percent of the regular
- 2 program foundation base per pupil, as defined in section
- 3 257.1, subsection 2, paragraph "b", as the pupil's district of
- 4 residence.
- 5 c. The school tuition credit may also include any moneys
- 6 received for the pupil as a result of the non-English-speaking
- 7 weighting pursuant to section 280.4, subsection 3, for the
- 8 previous school year multiplied by the state cost per pupil for
- 9 the previous school year, and if the pupil is also an eligible
- 10 pupil under section 261E.6, the tuition reimbursement amount
- 11 as provided in section 261E.7.
- 12 d. Amounts payable as a school tuition credit may be paid
- 13 in a lump sum or in installments to the accredited nonpublic
- 14 school as determined by the department of education.
- 15 4. A pupil enrolled in an accredited nonpublic school who
- 16 is receiving a school tuition credit shall be considered, for
- 17 state school foundation aid purposes, to be attending school
- 18 in the pupil's district of residence. A parent or quardian
- 19 may apply on an annual basis for a school tuition credit for
- 20 each year that the pupil is enrolled in an accredited nonpublic
- 21 school.
- 22 5. In the event that a pupil requires special education
- 23 pursuant to chapter 256B, a school tuition credit may be
- 24 utilized only in the event that the pupil is enrolled in an
- 25 accredited nonpublic school that maintains a special education
- 26 instructional program that is equipped to meet the pupil's
- 27 educational needs.
- 28 Sec. 5. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to school budget
- 29 years beginning on or after July 1, 2012.
- 30 EXPLANATION
- 31 This bill provides a school tuition credit for pupils
- 32 attending accredited nonpublic schools.
- 33 Pupils starting kindergarten in the school budget year
- 34 commencing July 1, 2012, may receive a school tuition credit
- 35 for attending an accredited nonpublic school. Each school

- 1 budget year thereafter, another grade is made eligible for
- 2 the school tuition credit, so that in the school budget year
- 3 commencing July 1, 2024, kindergarten through grades 12 are
- 4 included.
- 5 The bill requires that a parent or guardian submit an
- 6 application to the department of education (DE) by January
- 7 of the preceding school year indicating that the parent
- 8 or quardian intends to enroll the pupil in an accredited
- 9 nonpublic school. By March 1, DE shall notify the department
- 10 of management (DOM) of the number of pupils to receive school
- ll tuition credits.
- 12 DOM shall assign each designated pupil a credit equal to 35
- 13 percent of the regular program foundation base per pupil. DE
- 14 in consultation with DOM shall reduce the state aid payments
- 15 to a local school district for the following school budget
- 16 year by 65 percent of the regular program foundation base per
- 17 pupil attributable to each designated pupil. The funds not
- 18 paid to school districts due to the school tuition credit
- 19 shall remain in the general fund. A local school district of
- 20 residence shall then transfer 25 percent of the regular program
- 21 foundation base per pupil attributable to each designated
- 22 pupil directly to the applicable accredited nonpublic school
- 23 district and shall retain the remaining 10 percent of the
- 24 regular program foundation base per pupil attributable to each
- 25 designated pupil as the pupil's district of residence.
- 26 Beginning in the school budget year commencing July 1,
- 27 2024, and for succeeding budget years, if an accredited
- 28 nonpublic school's average enrollment equals 17 percent of the
- 29 combined enrollment of the local public school district and
- 30 the accredited nonpublic school, then DOM shall assign each
- 31 designated pupil a credit equal to 45 percent of the regular
- 32 program foundation base per pupil. DE in consultation with
- 33 DOM shall reduce the state aid payments to a local school
- 34 district for the following school budget year by 55 percent of
- 35 the regular program foundation base per pupil attributable to

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- 1 each designated pupil. The local school district of residence
- 2 shall transfer 30 percent of the regular program foundation
- 3 base per pupil attributable to each designated pupil directly
- 4 to the accredited nonpublic school and shall retain 15 percent
- 5 of the regular program foundation base per pupil as the pupil's
- 6 district of residence.
- 7 The credit may include additional moneys received for
- 8 the pupil for non-English-speaking programs or for tuition
- 9 reimbursement under the postsecondary enrollment options
- 10 program.
- 11 DE shall determine whether the credit amounts are to be paid
- 12 in a lump sum or in installments to the accredited nonpublic
- 13 schools.
- 14 A student attending an accredited nonpublic school shall
- 15 be counted as attending school in the pupil's district of
- 16 residence for state school foundation purposes. A parent or
- 17 guardian may reapply for the credit each year that the credit
- 18 is available and that the pupil is enrolled in an accredited
- 19 nonpublic school.
- 20 The bill provides that if a pupil requires special education
- 21 pursuant to Code chapter 256B, a school tuition credit may
- 22 be used only in the event that the pupil is enrolled in an
- 23 accredited nonpublic school which maintains a special education
- 24 instructional program that is appropriate to meet the pupil's
- 25 educational needs.
- 26 The state board of education is directed to adopt rules
- 27 relating to the applications for the school tuition credit.
- 28 Code section 257.6 is amended to reflect that pupils receiving
- 29 a credit are counted as part of a local public school
- 30 district's actual enrollment.
- 31 The bill applies to school budget years beginning on or after
- 32 July 1, 2012.
