- 10 EXPLANATION
- 11 This bill amends the FY 2012-2013 appropriations and
- 12 allocations to the Iowa department on aging. The bill
- 13 amends the appropriation to provide for funding at the FY
- 14 2011-2012 level and includes an additional appropriation of
- 15 \$19,640,000. The bill provides that in addition to any other
- 16 funding appropriated or allocated for the purposes specified,
- 17 \$19,640,000 of the funds appropriated under the bill are to be
- 18 allocated as follows: \$11,850,000 shall be used to provide
- 19 home and community-based services to reduce and slow the
- 20 growth of long-term care expenditures and to meet the mandate
- 21 of the Olmstead decision; \$2,500,000 shall be used for the
- 22 statewide aging and disabilities resource center; \$2,600,000
- 23 shall be used for elder abuse intervention and protection
- 24 services; \$390,000 shall be used to support the reduction
- 25 in area agencies on aging as required pursuant to 2011 Iowa
- 26 Acts, chapter 122, section 20; and \$2,300,000 shall be used
- 27 to address the unmet needs of seniors as identified in the
- 28 department's most recent unmet needs report.
