## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to funding for projects on state and local
- 2 roads and bridges in critical need of repair or maintenance,
- 3 and making an appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 8.55, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code
- 2 Supplement 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 a. The maximum balance of the fund is the amount equal to
- 4 two and one-half percent of the adjusted revenue estimate for
- 5 the fiscal year. If the amount of moneys in the Iowa economic
- 6 emergency fund is equal to the maximum balance, moneys in
- 7 excess of this amount shall be distributed as follows:
- 8 (1) The first sixty million dollars of the difference
- 9 between the actual net revenue for the general fund of the
- 10 state for the fiscal year and the adjusted revenue estimate for
- 11 the fiscal year shall be transferred to the taxpayers trust
- 12 fund.
- 13 (2) Moneys in excess of the amount transferred under
- 14 subparagraph (1), up to a maximum amount of sixty million
- 15 dollars, shall be transferred to the critical needs road fund
- 16 created under section 312B.1.
- 17 (2) (3) The remainder of the excess, if any, shall be
- 18 transferred to the general fund of the state.
- 19 Sec. 2. Section 8.58, Code Supplement 2011, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 8.58 Exemption from automatic application.
- 22 1. To the extent that moneys appropriated under section
- 23 8.57 do not result in moneys being credited to the general fund
- 24 under section 8.55, subsection 2, moneys appropriated under
- 25 section 8.57 and moneys contained in the cash reserve fund,
- 26 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, environment first fund, Iowa
- 27 economic emergency fund, and taxpayers trust fund, and critical
- 28 needs road fund shall not be considered in the application of
- 29 any formula, index, or other statutory triggering mechanism
- 30 which would affect appropriations, payments, or taxation rates,
- 31 contrary provisions of the Code notwithstanding.
- 32 2. To the extent that moneys appropriated under section
- 33 8.57 do not result in moneys being credited to the general fund
- 34 under section 8.55, subsection 2, moneys appropriated under
- 35 section 8.57 and moneys contained in the cash reserve fund,

- 1 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, environment first fund, Iowa
- 2 economic emergency fund, and taxpayers trust fund, and critical
- 3 needs road fund shall not be considered by an arbitrator or in
- 4 negotiations under chapter 20.
- 5 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 312B.1 Critical needs road fund.
- 6 l. A critical needs road fund is created in the state
- 7 treasury under the control of the department of transportation.
- 8 The fund shall be separate from the general fund of the state
- 9 and the balance in the fund shall not be considered part of
- 10 the balance of the general fund of the state. The fund shall
- 11 consist of moneys appropriated by the general assembly and any
- 12 revenues credited by law to the critical needs road fund. The
- 13 moneys in the fund are not subject to section 8.33 and shall
- 14 not be transferred, used, obligated, appropriated, or otherwise
- 15 encumbered except as provided in this section. Notwithstanding
- 16 section 12C.7, subsection 2, interest or earnings on moneys
- 17 deposited in the critical needs road fund shall be credited to
- 18 the fund.
- 19 2. Moneys in the critical needs road fund are appropriated
- 20 to the department of transportation to be used as directed by
- 21 the department exclusively for the repair and maintenance of
- 22 roads on the primary or secondary road system, or the municipal
- 23 street system, including bridges. The department shall
- 24 establish guidelines to be used by the department, counties,
- 25 and cities for identifying roads and bridges in critical
- 26 need of repair or maintenance and for the department to use
- 27 in evaluating and prioritizing state and local road projects
- 28 to receive funding under this section. Counties and cities
- 29 may apply for funding from the critical needs road fund by
- 30 submitting to the department proposals for projects on roads
- 31 under their respective jurisdictions. A qualifying proposal
- 32 shall include information regarding the status and condition
- 33 of the road that is the subject of the proposal, the plan for
- 34 completing the project, and any other information required by
- 35 the department. The department shall develop an application

- 1 process for counties and cities to use for the submission of
- 2 proposals for the use of funds under this section. Moneys
- 3 distributed from the critical needs road fund may be used
- 4 in combination with other available funding as necessary to
- 5 accomplish the completion of a qualifying project and to
- 6 accomplish the goal of reducing the number of Iowa roads and
- 7 bridges with critical needs.
- 8 EXPLANATION
- 9 This bill establishes a critical needs road fund in the state
- 10 treasury under the control of the department of transportation.
- 11 Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the department to be
- 12 used exclusively for repair and maintenance of state and local
- 13 roads. The department is authorized to direct the use of the
- 14 fund's resources according to guidelines to be established by
- 15 the department for identifying roads and bridges in critical
- 16 need of repair or maintenance and for prioritizing state
- 17 and local critical needs projects. Counties and cities
- 18 may submit proposals for the use of funds on roads under
- 19 their jurisdiction according to an application process to be
- 20 developed by the department. Moneys from the fund may be used
- 21 in combination with other available funding.
- 22 The bill provides that if the economic emergency fund
- 23 reaches the maximum balance, after the required transfer of a
- 24 portion of the excess to the taxpayers trust fund and before
- 25 any remaining excess is transferred to the general fund of the
- 26 state, any excess moneys in an amount up to \$60 million shall
- 27 be transferred to the critical needs road fund.
