Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 135.181 Bisphenol A prohibition.
 As used in this section, unless the context otherwise
 requires:

a. "Baby food" means a commercially available prepared solid
food consisting of a soft paste or an easily chewed food that
is intended for consumption by children two years of age or
younger.

8 b. "Infant formula" means commercially available milk-based 9 or soy-based powder, concentrated liquid, or ready-to-feed 10 substitute for human breast milk that is intended for infant 11 consumption.

12 c. "Reusable food or beverage container" means a receptacle 13 for storing food or beverages, including baby bottles, 14 spill-proof cups, sports bottles, and thermoses. "Reusable 15 food or beverage container" does not include food or beverage 16 containers intended for disposal after initial usage.

Beginning January 1, 2012, a person shall not
 manufacture, sell, or distribute in commerce in this state any
 reusable food or beverage container containing bisphenol A.

3. Beginning January 1, 2012, a person shall not
21 manufacture, sell, or distribute in commerce in this state any
22 infant formula or baby food stored in a plastic container, can,
23 or jar containing bisphenol A.

4. A manufacturer shall use the least toxic alternative when25 replacing bisphenol A in accordance with this section.

5. In complying with this section, a manufacturer shall not replace bisphenol A with a substance rated by the United States environmental protection agency as a class A, B, or C carcinogen or a substance listed on the agency's list of chemicals evaluated for carcinogenic potential as known or likely carcinogens, known to be human carcinogens, likely to be human carcinogens, or suggestive of being carcinogens.

33 6. In complying with this section, a manufacturer shall not 34 replace bisphenol A with a reproductive toxicant that has been 35 identified by the United States environmental protection agency

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1 as causing birth defects, reproductive harm, or developmental 2 harm. 7. A person who violates this section is subject to a civil 3 4 penalty of one thousand dollars for each violation. 5 EXPLANATION 6 This bill relates to the use of bisphenol A in certain 7 products. 8 The bill, beginning January 1, 2012, prohibits the 9 manufacture, sale, or distribution of any reusable food 10 or beverage container containing bisphenol A. The bill, 11 beginning January 1, 2012, prohibits the manufacture, sale, 12 or distribution of any infant formula or baby food stored in 13 a plastic container, can, or jar containing bisphenol A. The 14 bill requires manufacturers to use the least toxic alternative 15 when replacing bisphenol A in a product and prohibits the 16 use of certain substances as replacements for bisphenol A in 17 products. The bill provides that a person who violates the 18 provisions of the bill is subject to a civil penalty of \$1,000 19 for each violation.

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
