## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to county mental health and disability services
- 2 by making a supplemental appropriation for the fiscal year
- 3 beginning July 1, 2012, applying credits to certain county
- 4 obligations, and including effective date provisions.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. MEDICAID — APPROPRIATION AND BILLINGS FOR
2 COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH AND DISABILITY SERVICES.
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- 3 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
- 4 state to the department of human services for the fiscal year
- 5 beginning July 1, 2012, and ending June 30, 2013, the following
- 6 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
- 7 purposes designated:
- 8 To supplement the appropriation made for medical assistance
- 9 reimbursement and associated costs in 2011 Iowa Acts, chapter
- 10 129, section 122, and offset the credits applied in accordance
- 11 with subsection 2:
- 12 ..... \$ 750,000
- 2. If a county applied for assistance from the mental health
- 14 and disability services redesign transition fund pursuant to
- 15 2012 Iowa Acts, chapter 1120, section 23, but the county was
- 16 not recommended by the department of human services for any
- 17 award amount in the department's report on the transition
- 18 fund submitted to the general assembly on December 4, 2012,
- 19 the county shall receive a credit in accordance with this
- 20 subsection. The department shall apply a credit to the
- 21 county's obligation for outstanding Medicaid billings for
- 22 mental health and disability services provided prior to the
- 23 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012. The amount of the credit
- 24 shall be equal to the amount of the county's obligation or
- 25 \$150,000, whichever is less.
- 26 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed of
- 27 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 28 EXPLANATION
- 29 This bill relates to county mental health and disability
- 30 (MH/DS) services by making a supplemental appropriation for FY
- 31 2012-2013 and applying credits to certain county obligations.
- 32 Under the 2012 mental health and disability services
- 33 redesign legislation enacted in 2012 Iowa Acts, chapter 1120
- 34 (SF 2315), a mental health and disability services redesign
- 35 transition fund was created. Counties were authorized to

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- 1 apply to the department of human services for assistance to
- 2 continue current core MH/DS to target populations that are
- 3 not funded by the medical assistance (Medicaid) program.
- 4 Part of the redesign legislation provided for the state to
- 5 assume responsibility effective July 1, 2012, for paying the
- 6 nonfederal share of Medicaid program costs for adult MH/DS
- 7 in place of the counties. Counties remain obligated for the
- 8 nonfederal share of the Medicaid costs incurred prior to that
- 9 date.
- 10 In accordance with SF 2315, the department received
- 11 applications for transition fund assistance from counties and,
- 12 based on various criteria in the legislation and developed
- 13 by the department, made recommendations for specific funding
- 14 amounts to be awarded to counties under three different
- 15 scenarios. Under all three scenarios, the department
- 16 recommended that six counties should not receive any funding.
- 17 Of the six counties, five counties have outstanding Medicaid
- 18 billing obligations.
- 19 The bill makes a \$750,000 appropriation to the department
- 20 to supplement the FY 2012-2013 appropriation for Medicaid.
- 21 If a county applied for assistance from the transition fund
- 22 but the county was not recommended by the department for any
- 23 award amount, the county is eligible to receive a credit. The
- 24 credit is required to be applied to the county's obligation for
- 25 outstanding Medicaid billings. The amount of the credit is
- 26 equal to the amount of the county's obligation, or \$150,000,
- 27 whichever is less.
- 28 The bill takes effect upon enactment.
