A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to subsidized guardianships.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

H.F. 330

- 1 Section 1. SUBSIDIZED GUARDIANSHIP PROGRAM —
- 2 ELIGIBILITY. In determining eligibility requirements for
- 3 financial assistance to quardians under the subsidized
- 4 guardianship program, the department of human services shall
- 5 amend its administrative rules to provide the following:
- 6 l. Any adult person who is the grandparent or other relative
- 7 of a child and who has been named as a quardian of the child
- 8 under chapter 232 or 633 may be eligible to receive a subsidy.
- 9 2. The guardian must provide evidence of financial need in 10 the subsidized guardianship application.
- 11 3. The child who is the subject of the guardianship may be
- 12 of any age and need not be part of a sibling group.
- 13 4. The child who is the subject of the guardianship has been
- 14 the subject of a child abuse or family assessment report and
- 15 has been in the custody of the department of human services.
- 16 Sec. 2. TITLE IV-E GUARDIANSHIP ASSISTANCE STATE PLAN
- 17 AMENDMENT SUBSIDIZED GUARDIANSHIP PROGRAM. The department
- 18 of human services shall submit a Title IV-E quardianship
- 19 assistance state plan amendment to the United States department
- 20 of health and human services to allow Title IV-E funding to be
- 21 used for a subsidized guardianship program to enable children
- 22 in the care of grandparents and other relatives to exit state
- 23 care and be placed in permanent homes.
- 24 EXPLANATION
- 25 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 26 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 27 This bill requires the department of human services to amend
- 28 its administrative rules contained in 441 IAC ch. 204 relating
- 29 to eligibility requirements for guardians under the subsidized
- 30 guardianship program. The bill provides that any adult person
- 31 who is the grandparent or other relative of a child who has
- 32 been named as a guardian of the child under Code chapter 232
- 33 (juvenile justice) or 633 (probate) may be eligible to receive
- 34 a subsidy and that a guardian applicant must provide evidence
- 35 of financial need. The child who is the subject of the

- 1 guardianship may be of any age regardless of whether the child
- 2 is part of a sibling group, and must have been the subject of a
- 3 child abuse or family assessment report and in the custody of
- 4 the department of human services.
- 5 The bill requires the department of human services to
- 6 submit a Title IV-E quardianship assistance state plan
- 7 amendment to the United States department of health and human
- 8 services to allow Title IV-E funding through the federal
- 9 Fostering Connections to Success and Increasing Adoptions Act
- 10 of 2008 (Pub. L. No. 110-351) to be used for a subsidized
- 11 guardianship program to enable children to remain in the care
- 12 of grandparents and other relatives to avoid placement in state
- 13 care.
