#### Abstract

\section*{A BILL FOR}

1 An Act relating to the minimum guidelines for comprehensive 2 early childhood development services for at-risk 3 three-year-old and four-year-old children. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:


Section l. Section 256A.3, subsection 5, Code 2015, is amended by adding the following new paragraph:

NEW PARAGRAPH. $C$. Each member of the teaching staff employed to provide educational services for at-risk three-year-old and four-year-old children by a child care program receiving a grant under this subsection shall have a minimum of a baccalaureate degree in early childhood education, child development, elementary education, or early childhood special education which encompasses child development and learning of children from birth through kindergarten; family and community relationships; observing, documenting, and assessing young children; teaching and learning; and professional practices and development. The child care program shall also annually make available, and require each member of the teaching staff to complete, at least fifteen hours of professional development opportunities.

## EXPLANATION

The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

This bill requires each member of the teaching staff employed to provide educational services to at-risk
three-year-old and four-year-old children by a child care program receiving a grant from the child development coordinating council to have a minimum of a baccalaureate degree in early childhood education, child development, elementary education, or early childhood special education. The child care program must also annually make available at least 15 hours of professional development opportunities and require each member of the teaching staff to complete such professional development.
