House Study Bill 96 - Introduced

A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act exempting internet protocol-enabled service and voice
- 2 over internet protocol service from specified regulatory
- 3 authority.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 476.30 Internet protocol-enabled
 service and voice over internet protocol service — regulation.
 Notwithstanding any other provision to the contrary,
 a department, agency, board, or political subdivision of the
 state shall not by rule, order, or other means directly or
 indirectly regulate the entry, rates, terms, or conditions
 for internet protocol-enabled service or voice over internet
 protocol service.

9 2. For the purposes of this section:

10 a. "Internet protocol-enabled service" means any service, 11 capability, functionality, or application that uses internet 12 protocol or any successor protocol and enables an end user to 13 send or receive voice, data, or video communication in internet 14 protocol format or a successor format.

15 b. "Political subdivision" means the same as defined in 16 section 145A.2.

17 c. "Voice over internet protocol service" means an internet 18 protocol-enabled service that facilitates real-time, two-way 19 voice communication that originates from, or terminates at, a 20 user's location and permits the user to receive a call that 21 originates from the public switched telephone network and to 22 terminate a call on the public switched telephone network. 23 "Voice over internet protocol service" does not include a 24 service that uses ordinary customer premises equipment with 25 no enhanced functionality that originates from and terminates 26 on the public switched telephone network, undergoes no net 27 protocol conversion, and provides no enhanced functionality 28 to end users due to the provider's use of internet protocol 29 technology.

30 3. This section shall not be construed to modify or affect 31 the following:

32 *a.* The authority of the attorney general to take any action 33 pursuant to chapter 537, section 714.16, or any provision which 34 provides that a violation of that provision constitutes a 35 violation under section 714.16.

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1 b. The application or enforcement of a law or rule that may 2 apply generally to the conduct of business in this state.

The board's authority under 47 U.S.C. §§251 and 252. 3 C.

4 4. Providers of voice over internet protocol service shall 5 be subject to the following assessments and surcharges:

Surcharges for E911 emergency services under section 6 a. 7 34A.7.

8 b. Assessments for dual party relay service under section 9 477C.7.

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EXPLANATION

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The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 12 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

13 This bill provides that, notwithstanding any other provision 14 to the contrary, a department, agency, board, or political 15 subdivision of the state shall not by rule, order, or other 16 means directly or indirectly regulate the entry, rates, terms, 17 or conditions for internet protocol-enabled service or voice 18 over internet protocol service.

The bill defines "internet protocol-enabled service" to mean 19 20 any service, capability, functionality, or application that 21 uses internet protocol or any successor protocol and enables an 22 end user to send or receive voice, data, or video communication 23 in internet protocol format or a successor format. The bill 24 defines "voice over internet protocol service" to mean an 25 internet protocol-enabled service that facilitates real-time, 26 two-way voice communication that originates from, or terminates 27 at, a user's location and permits the user to receive a call 28 that originates from the public switched telephone network and 29 to terminate a call on the public switched telephone network. 30 The bill provides that "voice over internet protocol service" 31 does not include a service that uses ordinary customer premises 32 equipment with no enhanced functionality that originates from 33 and terminates on the public switched telephone network, 34 undergoes no net protocol conversion, and provides no enhanced 35 functionality to end users due to the provider's use of

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1 internet protocol technology. The bill references a definition
2 of "political subdivision" contained in Code section 145A.2 as
3 meaning any county, township, school district, or city.

The bill provides that the bill's provisions regarding 4 5 exemption from regulation shall not be construed to modify or 6 affect the authority of the attorney general to take any action 7 pursuant to Code chapter 537 relating to consumer protection 8 or Code section 714.16 relating to consumer fraud or to modify 9 or affect any provision which provides that a violation of 10 that provision constitutes a violation of the consumer fraud 11 provisions of Code section 714.16. Additionally, the bill's 12 provisions shall not be construed to modify or affect the 13 Iowa utility board's authority under federal law relating to 14 telecommunications carrier interconnection agreements and 15 procedures. Under the bill, providers of voice over internet 16 protocol service shall be subject to surcharges for enhanced 17 911 services pursuant to Code section 34A.7 and assessments for 18 dual party relay service pursuant to Code section 477C.7.

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
