- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 249A.30A, Code 2020, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 249A.30A Medical assistance personal needs allowance.
- 4 The personal needs allowance under the medical assistance
- 5 program, which may be retained by a person who is a resident
- 6 of a nursing facility, an intermediate care facility for
- 7 persons with an intellectual disability, or an intermediate
- 8 care facility for persons with mental illness, as defined in
- 9 section 135C.1, or a person who is a resident of a psychiatric
- 10 medical institution for children as defined in section 135H.1,
- 11 shall be fifty sixty dollars per month. A resident who has
- 12 income of less than fifty sixty dollars per month shall receive
- 13 a supplement from the state in the amount necessary to receive
- 14 a personal needs allowance of fifty sixty dollars per month, if
- 15 funding is specifically appropriated for this purpose.
- 16 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 19 This bill increases the personal needs allowance under the
- 20 Medicaid program which may be retained by a person who is a
- 21 resident of a nursing facility, an intermediate care facility
- 22 for persons with an intellectual disability, or an intermediate
- 23 care facility for persons with mental illness, or a person who
- 24 is a resident of a psychiatric medical institution for children
- 25 from \$50 to \$60 per month. Additionally, under the bill,
- 26 a resident who has income of less than \$60 per month shall
- 27 receive a supplement from the state in the amount necessary to
- 28 receive a personal needs allowance of \$60 per month, if funding
- 29 is specifically appropriated for this purpose.
