## House File 620 - Introduced

## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the dispensing of a refill of a chronic
- 2 maintenance drug to a patient.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 155A.29, Code 2019, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 155A.29 Prescription refills.
- 4 l. Except as specified in subsection 2 or 3, a prescription
- 5 for any prescription drug or device which is not a controlled
- 6 substance shall not be filled or refilled more than eighteen
- 7 months after the date on which the prescription was issued and
- 8 a prescription which is authorized to be refilled shall not be
- 9 refilled more than twelve times.
- 10 2. A pharmacist may exercise professional judgment by
- 11 refilling a prescription without prescriber authorization if
- 12 all of the following are true:
- 13 a. The pharmacist is unable to contact the prescriber after
- 14 reasonable efforts.
- 15 b. Failure to refill the prescription might result in
- 16 an interruption of therapeutic regimen or create patient
- 17 suffering.
- 18 c. The pharmacist informs the patient or the patient's
- 19 representative at the time of dispensing, and the practitioner
- 20 at the earliest convenience, that prescriber reauthorization
- 21 is required.
- 22 3. d. Prescriptions may be refilled once pursuant to this
- 23 subsection 2 for a period of time reasonably necessary for the
- 24 pharmacist to secure prescriber authorization.
- 25 3. a. In addition to the authorization for a pharmacist to
- 26 refill a prescription without prescriber authorization pursuant
- 27 to subsection 2, a pharmacist may exercise professional
- 28 judgment by refilling a prescription for a chronic maintenance
- 29 drug if all of the following are applicable:
- 30 (1) The pharmacist is unable, after reasonable efforts, to
- 31 obtain authorization from the prescriber or another health care
- 32 provider responsible for the patient's care.
- 33 (2) In the pharmacist's professional judgment, the refusal
- 34 to dispense the refill of the chronic maintenance drug will
- 35 endanger the patient's life or health or will disrupt essential

- 1 drug therapy for a chronic condition of the patient.
- 2 b. The pharmacist may dispense an amount of the chronic
- 3 maintenance drug not to exceed the amount of the most recent
- 4 prescription or the standard quantity of the drug dispensed.
- 5 c. The pharmacist shall dispense the chronic maintenance
- 6 drug refill in accordance with standard procedures and
- 7 documentation requirements adopted by rule of the board.
- 8 d. For the purposes of this subsection, "chronic maintenance
- 9 drug" means a drug, other than a controlled substance, that is
- 10 prescribed to a patient to be taken on a recurring basis, and
- 11 is used as a life-saving rescue drug for a chronic condition or
- 12 is essential to the continuation of drug therapy for a chronic
- 13 condition.
- 4. An authorization to refill a prescription drug order
- 15 shall be transmitted to a pharmacy by a prescriber or the
- 16 prescriber's authorized agent pursuant to section 155A.27,
- 17 except that prescription drug orders for controlled substances
- 18 shall be transmitted pursuant to section 124.308, and, if not
- 19 transmitted directly by the practitioner, shall also include
- 20 the name and title of the practitioner's agent completing the
- 21 transmission.
- 22 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 25 This bill provides that in addition to existing provisions
- 26 relating to the refilling of a prescription without prescriber
- 27 authorization, a pharmacist may exercise professional judgment
- 28 by refilling a prescription for a chronic maintenance drug
- 29 if the pharmacist is unable, after reasonable efforts, to
- 30 obtain authorization from the prescriber or another health care
- 31 provider responsible for the patient's care; and if in the
- 32 pharmacist's professional judgment, the refusal to dispense
- 33 the refill of the chronic maintenance drug will endanger the
- 34 patient's life or health or will disrupt essential drug therapy
- 35 for a chronic condition of the patient. The bill authorizes

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1 the pharmacist to dispense an amount of the chronic maintenance 2 drug not to exceed the amount of the most recent prescription 3 or the standard quantity of the drug dispensed, and to dispense 4 the chronic maintenance drug refill in accordance with standard 5 procedures and documentation requirements adopted by rules of 6 the board of pharmacy. The bill defines a chronic maintenance 7 drug as a drug, other than a controlled substance, that is 8 prescribed to a patient to be taken on a recurring basis, and 9 is used as a life-saving rescue drug for a chronic condition or 10 is essential to the continuation of drug therapy for a chronic 11 condition.
