# A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the family income eligibility requirement
- 2 for state child care assistance.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

#### S.F. 2110

Section 1. DIRECTIVE TO DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES
CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE — FAMILY INCOME ELIGIBILITY
REQUIREMENTS.

The department of human services shall amend its
administrative rules pursuant to chapter 17A to provide income
eligibility for state child care assistance, according to
family size for children needing basic care, to families whose
nonexempt gross monthly income does not exceed the following
amounts according to the following schedule:

10 a. One hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level, 11 effective July 1, 2020.

b. One hundred sixty percent of the federal poverty level,13 effective July 1, 2021.

14 c. One hundred seventy percent of the federal poverty level, 15 effective July 1, 2022.

16 d. One hundred eighty percent of the federal poverty level, 17 effective July 1, 2023.

18 e. One hundred ninety percent of the federal poverty level,19 effective July 1, 2024.

20 f. Two hundred percent of the federal poverty level, 21 effective July 1, 2025.

22 2. The department of human services shall amend its 23 administrative rules pursuant to chapter 17A to provide that 24 child care assistance under the child care assistance plus exit 25 eligibility program shall continue until a family's nonexempt 26 gross monthly income exceeds two hundred fifty percent of the 27 federal poverty level.

3. EMERGENCY RULES. The department of human services may adopt emergency rules under section 17A.4, subsection 3, and section 17A.5, subsection 2, paragraph "b", to implement the provisions of this Act and the rules shall be effective immediately upon filing unless a later date is specified in the rules. Any rules adopted in accordance with this section shall Also be published as a notice of intended action as provided in section 17A.4.

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### EXPLANATION

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The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

4 This bill relates to income eligibility requirements for 5 eligible families for state child care assistance.

6 The state child care assistance program is administered by 7 the department of human services (DHS). The bill directs DHS 8 to amend its administrative rules to provide income eligibility 9 for state child care assistance, according to family size for 10 children needing basic care, to families whose nonexempt gross 11 monthly income does not exceed 150 percent of the federal 12 poverty level, effective July 1, 2020; 160 percent of the 13 federal poverty level, effective July 1, 2021; 170 percent of 14 the federal poverty level, effective July 1, 2022; 180 percent 15 of the federal poverty level, effective July 1, 2023; 190 16 percent of the federal poverty level, effective July 1, 2024; 17 and 200 percent of the federal poverty level, effective July 1, 18 2025. The bill also directs DHS to amend its administrative 19 rules to provide that eligibility for the child care assistance 20 plus exit program shall continue until a family's nonexempt 21 gross monthly income exceeds 250 percent of the federal poverty 22 level.

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
