A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to elder abuse.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Section 235F.1, subsection 5, paragraph a, 2 unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2023, is amended to read as 3 follows: "Elder abuse" means any of the following relative to a 4 5 vulnerable elder in all aspects of the vulnerable elder's life, 6 liberty, and property: Sec. 2. Section 235F.1, subsections 8 and 17, Code 2023, are 7 8 amended to read as follows: *"Financial exploitation"* relative to a vulnerable elder 9 8. 10 means when a person stands in a position of trust or confidence 11 with the vulnerable elder and knowingly and by undue influence, 12 deception, coercion, fraud, or extortion, obtains control over 13 or otherwise uses or diverts the benefits, property, resources, 14 belongings, or assets of the vulnerable elder solely for the 15 benefit of someone other than the vulnerable elder and not for 16 the benefit of the vulnerable elder. "Financial exploitation" 17 includes alteration of a governing instrument by a person who 18 stands in a position of trust or confidence with the vulnerable 19 elder. *"Vulnerable elder"* means a person sixty years of age 20 17. 21 or older who is unable to protect himself or herself the 22 person's self from elder abuse as due to any of the following 23 circumstances: 24 a. As a result of a mental or physical condition or because. 25 b. Because of a personal circumstance which results in an 26 increased risk of physical, psychological, or financial harm 27 to the person. Clear and convincing evidence of physical, 28 psychological, or financial harm to the person creates a 29 rebuttable presumption that the person was unable to protect 30 the person's self. Sec. 3. Section 235F.1, Code 2023, is amended by adding the 31 32 following new subsection: 8A. "Governing instrument" means a 33 NEW SUBSECTION. 34 will; a trust; a deed; a custodianship; an insurance or 35 annuity policy; an account with a designation for payment on

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1 death; a security registered in beneficiary form; a pension, 2 profit-sharing, retirement, or other employment-related benefit 3 plan; a family limited partnership; an instrument creating or 4 exercising a power of attorney; an estate planning document; 5 or a dispositive, appointment, or nominative instrument of any 6 similar type.

7 Sec. 4. Section 235F.8, subsection 1, Code 2023, is amended 8 to read as follows:

9 1. A proceeding under this chapter shall <u>afford a vulnerable</u> 10 <u>elder due process of law, shall</u> be held in accordance with the 11 rules of civil procedure, except as otherwise set forth in this 12 chapter and in chapter 664A, and is in addition to any other 13 civil or criminal remedy.

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EXPLANATION

15The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with16the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

17 This bill relates to elder abuse.

18 The bill amends the definition of "elder abuse" to include 19 several actions taken relative to a vulnerable elder in all 20 aspects of the vulnerable elder's life, liberty, and property. 21 The bill amends the definition of "financial exploitation" 22 relative to a vulnerable elder to limit financial exploitation 23 to that which is solely for the benefit of a person other than 24 the vulnerable elder and not for the benefit of the vulnerable 25 elder. Additionally, under the bill, "financial exploitation" 26 includes alteration of a governing instrument by a person 27 who stands in a position of trust or confidence with the 28 vulnerable elder. The bill provides a definition of "governing 29 instrument".

The bill also amends the definition of "vulnerable elder" to include a person 60 years of age or older who is unable to protect the person's self from elder abuse due to a personal circumstance which results in an increased risk of physical, financial, or psychological harm to the person. The bill provides that clear and convincing evidence of physical,

The bill provides that a proceeding under Code chapter 235F 5 (elder abuse) shall afford a vulnerable elder due process of 6 law.

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
