NEW SECTION. 175C.1 DEFINITIONS. 1. "Commission" means the equine industry promotional 1 3 commission established pursuant to section 175C.2. 2. "Department" means the department of agriculture and 1 4 5 land stewardship. 1 3. "Fund" means the equine industry promotional fund created pursuant to section 175C.6. 1 7 4. "Secretary" means the secretary of agriculture. Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 175C.2 EQUINE INDUSTRY PROMOTIONAL 1 8 1 1 10 COMMISSION. 1. An equine industry promotional commission is 1 12 established within the department. 1 13 2. The commission shall be composed of the following 1 14 members: 1 15 a. Four nonvoting, ex officio members who shall include 1 16 all of the following: (1) The secretary of agriculture or the secretary's 1 17 1 18 designee. 1 19 (2) The dean of the college of agriculture at Iowa state 1 20 university or the dean's designee. 1 21 (3) A licensed veterinarian associated with the veterinary 1 22 teaching hospital at the college of veterinary medicine at 23 Iowa state university who is appointed by the dean of the 1 24 college. 1 25 (4) A person appointed by the president of the Iowa 26 association of community college presidents. The person shall 27 be actively engaged in the care and management of equines as 1 1 1 28 part of a curriculum at a community college. 1 29 b. Eleven voting members who shall be appointed by the 1 30 governor. The voting members must be presently actively 1 31 engaged or have long been actively engaged in providing for 1 32 the care and management of equines, including breeds of equine 33 common in this state. Ten of the members shall be actively 34 engaged in areas of equine expertise, which shall include at 1 1 35 least all of the following: (1) Quarterhorse racing.(2) Thoroughbred racing. 2 1 2 3 (3) Harness racing.
4 (4) Ring or arena events or judging competitions, which
5 may include shows, exhibitions, rodeos, or other contests.
6 (5) Recreational activities, which may include trail 2 2 2 7 riding. 2 8 (6) Activities which involve pulling wagons, carts, 9 carriages, or agricultural equipment or implements. 2 2 10 (7) Ranching activities such as herding and roping 2 11 livestock. (8) Breeding equines.(9) Support services providing for routine care and 2 12 2 13 14 management, which may include auctioneers, stables, trainers, 15 tack dealers, feed dealers, or ferriers.
16 (10) The practice of veterinary medicine as a member in 2 16

3. The governor shall appoint the voting members based on 2 20 a list of nominations submitted by organizations or 2 21 individuals representing areas of equine expertise.

2 22 Appointments of voting members are subject to the requirements 2 23 of sections 69.16 and 69.16A. In addition, the appointments 24 shall be geographically balanced. Unless the governor

25 determines that it is not feasible, at least one person 26 appointed as a voting member shall reside in each of the 2 27 state's congressional districts at the time of appointment. 2.8

- 4. Except for initial appointees, the voting members shall 29 serve three=year terms. However, the governor shall appoint 30 initial members to serve for two=year or three=year terms to 31 ensure the appointment of at least one member each year. 32 member is eligible for reappointment but shall not serve for A vacancy on the commission 33 more than two consecutive terms. 34 shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the regular term 35 in the same manner as regular appointments are made. A member 1 filling an unexpired term shall not serve for more than seven 2 consecutive years. A former member may be appointed to the 3 commission if the former member has not served on the 4 commission for two years.
- 5. The commission shall elect a chairperson and other 6 officers from among its voting members as provided by the commission. The commission shall meet on a regular basis and at the call of the chairperson or upon the written request to 8 the chairperson of five or more voting members. 10 commission shall adopt rules for the conduct of its business and may provide for the establishment of committees. 11
 - 6. Members shall not receive compensation.
- Six voting members constitute a quorum and the 3 14 affirmative vote of a majority of the voting members present 3 15 is necessary for any substantive action to be taken by the 3 16 commission. The majority shall not include any member who has 17 a conflict of interest and a statement by a member that the 3 18 member has a conflict of interest is conclusive for this 3 19 purpose. A vacancy in the membership does not impair the 3 20 duties of the commission.
- 175C.3 COMMISSION'S MISSION. Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. The commission is the principal public organization devoted 3 23 to promoting the collective interests of the state's equine 24 industry.
 - NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. 175C.4 COMMISSION DUTIES.
 - In carrying out its mission, as provided in section 175C.3, the commission may do all of the following:
 - Market and promote the equine industry.
- Maintain an accurate and current database regarding the 3 30 equine industry and equine communities.
 - 3. Collect and disseminate accurate information regarding equines to the equine industry and equine communities. 32
 - 4. Initiate or support equine educational programs.

 - 5. Initiate or support equine research. Sec. 5. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 175C.5 DEPARTMENT DUTIES.
 - The department shall assist the commission in carrying out its mission as provided in section 175C.3 by doing all of the following:
 - 1. Furnishing facilities, supplies, and clerical assistance.
 - 2. Assisting the commission in carrying out its duties as provided in section 175C.4.
 - 3. Administering the equine industry promotional fund as provided in section 175C.6.
 - 10 Sec. 6. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 175C.6 EQUINE INDUSTRY PROMOTIONAL 11 FUND.
- 4 12 1. An equine industry promotional fund is created in the 4 13 state treasury under the administration of the department and 4 14 the control of the commission. The fund is composed of moneys 4 15 available to and obtained or accepted by the department from 4 16 the United States or private sources for placement in the 17 fund.
- 4 18 Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the commission 4 19 exclusively to assist the commission in carrying out its 20 duties as provided in section 175C.4, and the department in 4 21 carrying out its duties as provided in section 175C.5.
- 22 3. Section 8.33 shall not apply to moneys in the fund. 23 Notwithstanding section 12C.7, moneys earned as income or 24 interest from the fund shall remain in the fund until expended 25 as provided in this section.
