Hall of the House of Representatives Des Moines, Iowa, Monday, January 27, 2003

The House met pursuant to adjournment at 1:03 p.m., Speaker pro tempore Carroll in the chair.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

Read first time and referred to committee on ways and means.

Read first time and referred to committee on human resources.
