Thirty-ninth Calendar Day - Twenty-eighth Session Day

The House met pursuant to adjournment at 8:47 a.m., Speaker Rants in the chair.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

House File 247, by Connors, a bill for an act making changes to workers' compensation laws in Iowa.

Read first time and referred to committee on **commerce**, **regulation and labor**.

House File 248, by Whitaker, Tymeson, Quirk, Hogg, Murphy, Reasoner, Whitead, Swaim, Struyk, Gaskill, Petersen, Heddens, D. Hanson, Miller, Dandekar, Myers, Winckler, Lensing, Greimann, and Davitt, a bill for an act relating to a request for an absentee ballot on behalf of a member of the armed forces of the United States.

Read first time and referred to committee on state government.

House File 249, by committee on public safety, a bill for an act relating to the manufacture, delivery, possession with the intent to manufacture or deliver, or conspiring to manufacture, deliver, or possess with the intent to manufacture or deliver flunitrazepam, and providing a penalty.

Read first time and placed on the calendar.

<u>House File 250</u>, by committee on public safety, a bill for an act relating to the criminal penalties for an assault on members of certain occupations.

Read first time and placed on the calendar.

<u>House File 251</u>, by Wilderdyke, Upmeyer, Jones, Elgin, and De Boef, a bill for an act relating to solid waste commissioners and providing a penalty.

Read first time and referred to committee on **local government**.

<u>House File 252</u>, by J. K. Van Fossen and Petersen, a bill for an act relating to the repeal of the state inheritance tax and state qualified use inheritance tax.

Read first time and referred to committee on ways and means.

House File 255, by committee on natural resources, a bill for an act relating to fees charged to certain private water supply contractors, establishing a private water supply system account within the water quality protection fund, and appropriating moneys in the account.

Read first time and referred to committee on appropriations.

<u>House File 256</u>, by Alons, De Boef, Manternach, Lukan, Hoffman, Chambers, Boddicker, Mertz, Boal, Watts, and Roberts, a bill for an act relating to the regulation of office-based surgical sites.

Read first time and referred to committee on state government.

MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

The following message was received from the Senate:

Mr. Speaker: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the Senate has on February 19, 2003, passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the House is asked:

Senate File 97, a bill for an act relating to highway, aviation, motor vehicle transportation and public transit, including regulation of junkyards along highways and placement of political signs, elimination of the aviation hangar revolving loan fund, applications for certificates of title by motor vehicle dealers, fees charged for driver's licenses and nonoperator's identification cards and making an appropriation, security interests in motor vehicles, charges financed in a motor vehicle retail installment transaction, confidentiality of motor vehicle accident reports, requirements for motor carrier safety rules, exemptions for certain motor vehicle operators from motor carrier safety rules and hazardous materials transportation regulations, load limits for vehicles transporting construction machinery, urban public transit funding, and tariffs charged by motor carriers of household goods, and including effective and retroactive applicability date provisions.

COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE

Committee Bill (Formerly House Study Bill 142), a concurrent resolution requesting that the United States Congress take all action required to preserve free and private enterprise, prevent monopoly, and protect consumers including by immediately enacting legislation to prohibit livestock packers from owning, controlling, or feeding livestock to such an extent that producers can no longer materially participate in the management of their livestock operations as provided in Senate Bill 27 introduced by the Honorable Senator Charles E. Grassley and cosponsored by the Honorable Senator Tom Harkin and others.

Fiscal Note is not required.

Recommended Amend and Do Pass February 20, 2003.

COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SAFETY

Committee Bill (Formerly <u>House Study Bill 89</u>), relating to the withdrawal of blood without a warrant from a person under arrest for an operating-while-intoxicated offense when the arrest results from a traffic accident resulting in death or personal injury reasonably likely to cause death.

Fiscal Note is not required.

Committee Bill (Formerly <u>House File 113</u>), authorizing the issuance of special cattlemen's registration plates to owners of motor trucks.
