Fifty-seventh Calendar Day - Fortieth Session Day

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

House File 488, by committee on local government, a bill for an act relating to state land management and planning and local land management and planning for certain counties and cities and providing effective dates.

House File 489, by committee on human resources, a bill for an act relating to programs and services under the purview of the department of human services, and providing for retroactive applicability and effective dates.

<u>House File 490</u>, by committee on local government, a bill for an act relating to the right of condemnation of owners of certain land and including effective and applicability date provisions.

<u>House File 491</u>, by committee on agriculture, a bill for an act relating to tax credits and associated refunds for cooperatives engaged in the production of value-added agricultural products, and providing for its applicability.
