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FUNDING SUMMARY

- Makes FY 2012 General Fund supplemental appropriations of \$8.5 million to the Department of Corrections (DOC) and creates a third round of funding available from the Mental Health Risk Pool (\$5.0 million). Page 1, Line 5

SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS

Department of Corrections

- Provides an FY 2012 General Fund supplemental appropriation of \$8.5 million to the DOC for the nine prisons, Central Office, and eight Community-Based Corrections (CBC) District Departments. Page 1, Line 6

Mental Health Risk Pool

- Makes \$5.0 million from the Mental Health Risk Pool available for a third round of applications in FY 2012. Funding will be distributed first to counties that currently have a waiting list, second to counties with individuals from the new statewide Intellectual Disabilities Waiver waiting list, and third to all other counties that meet requirements as set forth by the Iowa Code. Requires the funds remaining in the Mental Health Risk Pool to be distributed in accordance with this Section.

DETAIL: There is \$5.0 million remaining in the Mental Health Risk Pool after two rounds of distribution from the fund.

5 16 3. a. A county with individuals on a waiting list, as of
 5 17 the effective date of this section, for services covered under
 5 18 the county's county management plan is eligible to apply for a
 5 19 distribution of assistance under this section.

Specifies the criteria counties must meet to be eligible to apply for funds from the Mental Health Risk Pool.

DETAIL: To be eligible to apply, counties:

5 20 b. In addition, a county may apply for assistance to
 5 21 cover the nonfederal share of medical assistance waiver costs
 5 22 chargeable to the county for the remainder of the fiscal
 5 23 year of individuals who moved from the newly implemented
 5 24 state waiting list for the medical assistance program home
 5 25 and community-based services waiver for persons with an
 5 26 intellectual disability.
 5 27 c. In addition, a county may apply for risk pool assistance
 5 28 based on the basic eligibility conditions and circumstances
 5 29 specified in section 426B.5, subsection 2. The dates specified
 5 30 in this section shall apply in lieu of the dates in section
 5 31 426B.5, subsection 2, and the temporary funding increase
 5 32 provided to counties for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 5 33 2009, through the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment
 5 34 Act of 2009, Pub.L. No.111-5, shall be disregarded. However,
 5 35 the other basic eligibility requirements for risk pool
 6 1 assistance and all other requirements in section 426B.5,

- Must have individuals on a waiting list for services under the county management plan, as of the effective date of this Section.
- Must have individuals to serve from the newly created statewide Medicaid Intellectual Disability waiting list and the county is responsible to pay for the nonfederal share.
- Meet basic eligibility requirements as set forth by the Iowa Code.

6 3 4. All of the following provisions shall apply to a funding
 6 4 distribution under this section:

6 5 a. A county's application for the funding distribution must
 6 6 be received by the department within 10 calendar days of the
 6 7 enactment date of this section.

Requires counties to apply for funds within 10 calendar days of enactment.

6 8 b. The county's application shall provide all of the
 6 9 following information:
 6 10 (1) A declaration that the county cannot provide services

Requires counties to meet all application requirements set forth in this Section.

6 11 in accordance with the county's management plan and remain in
 6 12 compliance with the 99 percent budgeting requirement in section
 6 13 331.439, subsection 5, resulting in the creation of a waiting
 6 14 list or the need for the funding requested.

6 15 (2) An accounting of the individuals to be removed from
 6 16 the county's waiting list or to have services funded with risk
 6 17 pool moneys as a result of the funding applied for under this
 6 18 subsection, along with the following information in a format
 6 19 specified by the department:

6 20 (a) Each individual's unique client identifier established
 6 21 pursuant to section 225C.6A, subsection 3.

6 22 (b) The date the individual was originally placed on the
 6 23 county waiting list, removed from the state waiting list, or
 6 24 would be subject to a service reduction or elimination without
 6 25 the risk pool funding requested.

6 26 (c) The services needed by the individual.

6 27 (d) The projected cost for each service needed for that
 6 28 individual for the period beginning on the date the individual
 6 29 is removed from the county or state waiting list, or the date
 6 30 of receipt of the risk pool funding requested, through June 30,
 6 31 2012.

6 32 (e) The total cost for all of the services for each
 6 33 individual for the fiscal year.

6 34 c. The application shall be accompanied by a signed
 6 35 statement by the county's board of supervisors certifying
 7 1 that the individuals for whom funding is provided under this
 7 2 subsection will not, through June 30, 2012, be placed by the
 7 3 county on a waiting list for services.

Requires counties to certify that individuals receiving funding under this Section will not be placed on a waiting list for services in this fiscal year.

7 4 d. Funding shall be distributed in the following priority
 7 5 order:

7 6 (1) For counties with individuals on a waiting list as
 7 7 described in subsection 3, paragraph "a".

7 8 (2) If funding remains after meeting the need described
 7 9 in subparagraph (1), for counties applying for assistance to
 7 10 cover the nonfederal share of medical assistance costs for
 7 11 individuals who moved from the state waiting list as described
 7 12 in subsection 3, paragraph "b".

7 13 (3) If funding remains after meeting the need described in
 7 14 subparagraphs (1) and (2), for counties applying in accordance
 7 15 with the basic eligibility conditions and circumstances
 7 16 specified in section 426B.5, subsection 2, as described in
 7 17 subsection 3, paragraph "c".

Requires funds to be distributed first to counties that currently have a waiting list, second to counties applying for the nonfederal share for individuals from the Intellectual Disabilities Waiver waiting list, and third to all other counties meeting the requirements set forth by the Iowa Code.

7 18 e. The risk pool board may accept or reject an application
 7 19 for assistance in whole or in part if the board determines
 7 20 the application does not meet the intent of this section or

Permits the Mental Health Risk Pool Board to accept or reject an application in whole and prorate distribution of funding as necessary to conform with the amount available.

7 21 a requirement of this section and, subject to the priority
 7 22 order specified in paragraph "d", may prorate distribution of
 7 23 funding as necessary to conform to the amount available for
 7 24 distribution. The decision of the risk pool board is final.
 7 25 The risk pool board shall issue a funding decision within 15
 7 26 working days of the final receipt date for applications.

7 27 f. The funding addressed by this section shall be
 7 28 distributed within 15 working days of the date the risk pool
 7 29 board's funding decision is issued.

7 30 5. If moneys from a distribution made under this section
 7 31 are not expended by a county by November 1, 2012, for services
 7 32 provided prior to July 1, 2012, the county shall reimburse the
 7 33 unexpended moneys to the department by November 30, 2012, and
 7 34 the moneys reimbursed shall be credited to the risk pool in the
 7 35 property tax relief fund.

8 1 6. The risk pool board shall submit a report to the governor
 8 2 and general assembly on or before December 31, 2012, regarding
 8 3 the expenditure of funds distributed under this section.

8 4 DIVISION III
 8 5 EFFECTIVE DATE

8 6 Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed of
 8 7 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

Requires Mental Health Risk Pool funds to be distributed within 15 working day of the Board's funding decision.

Funds distributed per this section that are not expended by November 1, 2012, for services provided before July 1, 2012, must be reimbursed by the county to the Mental Health Risk Pool.

Requires the Risk Pool Board to submit a report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before December 31, 2012, regarding funds distributed in the Section.

This Bill is effective on enactment.
