

A BILL

FOR AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS EIGHT AND NINE OF CHAPTER SEVENTY-FIVE OF
THE LAWS OF THE EIGHTEENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That section 8, of chapter seventy-five, of the acts of the eighteenth general
2 assembly be and the same is hereby amended by striking out all after the word, "utility," in
3 the fifth line of said section, and by adding in lieu thereof the following:

4 "Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to authorize the sale of intoxicating liquors
5 for any other purpose than as a medicine, and any person being a registered pharmacist, who
6 shall sell, or give away intoxicating liquors for any other purpose than as a medicine, or who
7 shall retail, sell, or give away intoxicating liquors to any habitual drunkard, or to any minor,
8 except on the written order of the parent or guardian of said minor, shall be punished as
9 provided in chapter 6, title XI, of the Code and shall in all respects be amenable to the pro-
10 visions of said chapter, and in addition thereto, upon final conviction of any registered phar-
11 macist of any violation of the provisions of this chapter, or of said chapter 6, of title XI, of the
12 Code, it shall be the duty of the clerk of the court in which, or the justice of the peace before
13 whom, such conviction is had to transmit, forthwith, a certified copy of the record entry of such
14 conviction to the commissioners of pharmacy, who shall thereupon strike the name of the
15 person so convicted from the register; and the board of supervisors of each county shall have
16 jurisdiction and power to investigate and determine charges of violation of law in the sale
17 of intoxicating liquors against any registered pharmacist in the county, upon complaint hav-
18 ing been made in writing, and after giving the accused notice of the charges against him
19 and opportunity for hearing, and if they find said charges sustained, they shall so certify to the
20 commissioners of pharmacy, who shall thereupon strike the name of such person from the
21 register. Every registered pharmacist shall keep a record of all intoxicating liquors sold by
22 him, showing the amount of each sale, and when and to whom sold, and shall make a
23 monthly report of such sales under oath to the county auditor, who shall keep the same on
24 file in his office, and open to public inspection, and the amounts of liquors sold as shown by

26 liquor has been sold. The drinking of intoxicating liquors on the premises of a registered
27 pharmacist shall be *prima facie* evidence of the sale of such liquors contrary to law.

SEC. 2. That section 9 of said chapter be and the same is hereby amended by striking
2 out all after the word "medicine," in the ninth line from the last, and enacting in lieu thereof
3 the following: "Any violation of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of
4 not less than twenty-five dollars, and not more than one hundred dollars. In addition
5 thereto, for repeated violations of this section, the name of the person offending shall be
6 stricken from the register. The name of any person who has been registered upon false rep-
7 resentations or by fraudulent means, shall be stricken from the register. The commissioners
8 of pharmacy shall have jurisdiction in all cases for striking from the register except for ques-
9 tions of law respecting intoxicating liquors, which shall be as hereinbefore provided.
