

## A BILL

FOR AN ACT TO EXTEND THE PRIVILEGES OF HIGH SCHOOLS TO PUPILS FROM RURAL DISTRICTS UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

*As it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

SECTION 1. By and with the advice of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, it shall  
2 be the duty of the County Superintendent to prepare and recommend for adoption a course  
3 of study for the rural schools of the county, said course of study to be arranged as a prepar-  
4 atory course for the High School department of the graded schools of the cities or towns of  
5 the county.

SEC. 2. Any rural school desiring to secure the benefit of this act, shall adopt the recom-  
2 mended course of study provided for in section 1.

SEC. 3. Any pupil having completed said prescribed course of study, and received certi-  
2 ficate thereof, may be admitted to any High School of the county upon the same conditions  
3 as resident pupils of the high school district are admitted, and shall enjoy all the privileges  
4 of said school, subject to the rules and regulations of said high school.

SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the principal of said High School, at the close of each  
2 term of school to prepare the tuition accounts of any herein described pupils, and transmit  
3 said accounts to the school secretary. It is hereby made the duty of said secretary to send  
4 the several tuition accounts to the various secretaries of districts from which said rural  
5 pupils have come.

SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of the secretary of each district receiving such tuition ac-  
2 counts to forward at once to said secretary of High School, the amounts called for, the  
3 money being paid from the Teachers' Fund of said rural district.

SEC. 6. All acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
