## A BILL FOR

An Act to amend sections seventeen hundred thirty-four (1734), seventeen hundred twenty-seven (1727), seventeen hundred twenty-five (1725), seventeen hundred thirty-three (1733), and seventeen hundred thirty-one (1731) of the code, 1924, relating to regulations on fishing.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

1 Section 1. Section seventeen hundred thirty-four (1734)  
2 of the code, 1924, is hereby amended by striking out of lines  
3 twelve (12), thirteen (13), and fourteen (14) the following: "and  
4 extending not more than half the distance across such streams,"  
5 and inserting in lieu thereof the following: "and providing it is  
6 not of a greater length than one-half the distance across the  
7 stream"

1 Sec. 2. Section seventeen hundred twenty-seven (1727)  
2 of the code, 1924, is hereby amended by striking from line six  
3 (6) the word "meandered"

1 Sec. 3. Section seventeen hundred twenty-five (1725)  
2 of the code, 1924, is hereby amended by striking from line two  
3 (2) of subdivision one (1) the word "meandered"

1 Sec. 4. Section seventeen hundred thirty-three (1733)  
2 of the code, 1924, is hereby amended by striking the comma follow-  
3 ing the word "pike" in line three (3) and inserting the following:  
4 "less than fourteen (14) inches in length.": and further amend  
5 by adding the word "any" before the word "pickerel" in line four (4).

1     Sec: 5. Section seventeen hundred thirty-one (1731) of  
2 the code, 1924, is hereby amended by adding a comma after the word  
3 “bass” in line one (1) of subdivision two (2) and adding immediately  
4 thereafter the following: “crappies or bluegills.”; also further  
5 amend by striking from line one (1) of subdivision three (3) the  
6 following: “craddie.”

7     Further amend said section by adding the following sub-  
8 division between lines fourteen (14) and fifteen (15):

9     “Any other kinds of fish, whether game, or nongame, in  
10 the northern zone from December first to May fourteenth, or in the  
11 southern zone from November fifteenth to April thirtieth.”
