## A BILL FOR

An Act to make appropriation for the payment of state and other expenses.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

1 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any fund in  
2 the state treasury not otherwise appropriated the following sums  
3 to pay the claims and expenses as hereinafter indicated:

4 (1) To W. R. Maines, Judge District Court of Davenport,  
5 Iowa, for expense incurred while performing his duties as said  
6 judge at Maquoketa, Jackson county, Iowa, the sum of nine and  
7  $\frac{87}{100}$  dollars (\$9.87).

8 (2) To J. J. Eno for expenses incurred in connection  
9 with reporting the case of State vs. Park A. Findley,  
10 Des Moines, Polk county, Iowa, the sum of five and  $\frac{20}{100}$  dollars
