STATE APPROPRIATION BILL

Prepared by E. L. Hogue, Director of the Budget, Under Section 333,
Code of Iowa, 1927

A BILL FOR

An Act to establish the general fund for the state of Iowa, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1929, and ending June 30, 1931, and to appropriate therefrom for all departments and various divisions thereof, of the state of Iowa, for all purposes provided by law, for the said biennium.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. That the amount derived from direct taxation, other
2 than from the bonus levy, during the fiscal years beginning July 1,
3 1929, and July 1, 1930, and ending June 30, 1930, and June 30, 1931,
4 respectively, together with any unexpended appropriations at the
5 close of the biennium ending June 30, 1929, and all revenue from
6 sources other than direct taxation which is available for appropria-
7 tion for state purposes, and all other money in the state treasury
8 which is not by law segregated, shall be established as a general fund,
9 and so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be, and the same is
10 hereby appropriated for the biennium beginning July 1, 1929, and
11 ending June 30, 1931, in the following manner and for the following
12 uses, to-wit:
