A BILL FOR

An Act to legalize the practice of Naprapathy by certain Persons in the State of Iowa.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. That Whereas, Banner Howard, Harry Walter
2 Harmer and Ruth Kelley Perrow, are each now and have been
3 heretofore for many years, engaged in the practice of
4 Naprapathy, a method of healing common ailments without drugs
5 or surgery, and which does not include either contagious
6 diseases or obstetrics but does include colds and Influenza;
7 and Whereas, the question has arisen as to their legal right
8 to so practice said Naprapathy or to continue so to do, there-
9 fore Be it Enacted, that all of their acts and each of them,
10 the said Banner Howard, Harry Walter Harmer and Ruth Kelley
11 Perrow, heretofore practicing said Naprapathy in the State of
12 Iowa, be and same are hereby legalized and made lawful, the
13 same as if they had severally been legalized so to practice
14 Naprapathy. And they are hereby authorized legally to continue
15 the said practice of Naprapathy as heretofore, and the State
16 Board of Health of the State of Iowa is hereby authorized and
17 directed to issue to them and to each of them severally, a
18 permit authorizing and permitting them and each of them to
19 practice Naprapathy in the State of Iowa in the way and manner
20 herein defined and as heretofore practiced.

1 **Sec. 2. This act beeing deemed of immediate importance,**
2 **shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication**
3 **in the Cedar Rapids Gazette, a newspaper published in Cedar**
4 **Rapids, Iowa, without expense to the State of Iowa, also the**
5 **Burlington Hawkeye, a newspaper published at Burlington, Iowa.**
