A BILL FOR

An Act making an appropriation for the payment of typewriter rental, miscellaneous expenses of the Forty-eighth General Assembly, and other expenses that are payable from the general fund of the state.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any funds
2 in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the following
3 sums, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to pay the claims
4 and expenses indicated.

1 Sec. 2. To the several typewriter agencies for machines
2 furnished the Forty-eighth General Assembly:

3 L. C. Smith & Corona Typewriters, Inc., for the house of
4 representatives, rental for typewriters and purchase of a new
5 typewriter for enrolling bills, the sum of five hundred seventy
6 dollars and fifty-one cents (\$570.51); and for the senate, for
7 rental for typewriters, purchase of new typewriter for enrolling
8 bills, and ribbons for and repairs on state-owned typewriters,
9 the sum of four hundred forty-six dollars and eighty-one cents
10 (\$446.81).

11 Underwood Elliott Fisher Company, Inc., for the house of

12 representatives for rental for typewriters, the sum of one hundred
13 fifty dollars (\$150.00); and for the senate, for typewriter rib-
14 bons and typewriter rental, the sum of ninety-four dollars and
15 seventy-five cents (\$94.75).

16 Royal Typewriter Company, for the house of representatives,
17 for rental for typewriters, the sum of thirty-two dollars (\$32.00);
18 and for the senate, for rental for typewriters, the sum of one
19 hundred thirty dollars (\$130.00).

20 Remington-Rand, Inc., for the house of representatives, for
21 rental for typewriters, the sum of thirty dollars (\$30.00).

1 Sec. 3. To the Des Moines Rubber Stamp Works for badges
2 and supplies furnished the Forty-eighth General Assembly, for
3 the house of representatives, the sum of seventy-two dollars and
4 seventy cents (\$72.70) and for the senate, the sum of forty-one
5 dollars and sixty-five cents (\$41.65).

1 Sec. 4. To A. C. Gustafson, chief clerk of the house of
2 representatives, for postage, telegrams and necessary expenses
3 incurred and paid by him in connection with the duties of his of-
4 fice during the Forty-eighth General Assembly, the sum of fifty-
5 eight dollars and five cents (\$58.05).

1 Sec. 5. To Walter H. Beam, secretary of the senate, for
2 postage, supplies and other expenses incurred and paid by him
3 in connection with the duties of his office during the Forty-eighth
4 General Assembly, the sum of forty-eight dollars and seventy-two
5 cents (\$48.72).

1 Sec. 6. To Tildon Manufacturing Company of Ames, Iowa,

2 for coats for pages in the house of representatives and in the
3 senate, the sum of one hundred nineteen dollars and seventy-four
4 cents (\$119.74).

1 Sec. 7. To the executive council, for telephone, telegraph
2 and express charges, supplies, and postage, the sum of three
3 thousand dollars (\$3000.00).

1 Sec. 8. To the state printing board, for printing for the
2 Forty-eighth General Assembly, the sum of forty-two thousand
3 four hundred seventy-eight dollars and seventy-five cents
4 (\$42,478.75).

1 Sec. 9. To John Heerema, secretary of the state pharmacy
2 board, for extra expenses, eighty-seven dollars and fifty cents
3 (\$87.50).

1 Sec. 10. To Dean W. Peisen, for expenses incurred in attend-
2 ing the national conference on Interstate Trade Barriers in accord-
3 ance with House Resolution 12, the sum of forty-one dollars and
4 eighty-three cents (\$41.83).

1 Sec. 11. To Koch Brothers, for the house of representatives,
2 for typewriter desk, stenographer's chair and equipment, the sum
3 of sixty-eight dollars and sixty-five cents (\$68.65); and for
4 the senate, for paper and supplies, the sum of fourteen dollars
5 and ninety cents (\$14.90).

1 Sec. 12. To the Savery Hotel, for office space for the com-
2 mittee on consolidation and co-ordination of state government of
3 the house of representatives, the sum of five dollars (\$5.00).

1 Sec. 13. To the following named persons, the amounts: as

2 indicated, for expenses incurred in the senate investigation of
3 state institutions under the board of control:

4 Marjorie Long, typist, one hundred thirty dollars (\$130.00);
5 Paul Brookins, stenotypist, forty-seven dollars and eight cents
6 (\$47.08); Robert Hoffman, stenotypist, one hundred one dollars
7 and fifty-seven cents (\$101.57); Dr. A. J. Havlick, professional
8 services, ten dollars (\$10.00); Ena Hickerson, witness fee and
9 mileage, eleven dollars and twenty cents (\$11.20); Carrie McKinney,
10 photographer, twelve dollars (\$12.00); Robert B. Tabor, photo-
11 grapher, thirty-three dollars and seventy-five cents (\$33.75);
12 Jane Niles, extra services, sixty dollars (\$60.00); Anna Miletich,
13 for transcripts of evidence, sixty-four dollars (\$64.00); and
14 Chamberlain Hotel, for office space, four dollars and fifty cents
15 (\$4.50).

1 Sec. 14. To the following named persons, the amounts as
2 indicated, for services not otherwise provided for: in the house
3 of representatives, Kenneth Kay, page, legislative expense, twelve
4 dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50); and in the senate, W. J. Scar-
5 borough, reading clerk, extra service, seventy-five dollars and
6 sixty cents (\$75.60); Wilbur Knop, page, twelve dollars and fifty
7 cents (\$12.50); Laura E. Hicks, postoffice assistant, ten dollars
8 (\$10.00); Harry Upham, assistant file clerk, eight dollars (8.00);
9 Leo Ritchie, fifty cents (50c) per day from February 15th up to
10 and including the final day of the session; Joe Carney, one dollar
11 (\$1.00) per day from April 16th up to and including the final day
12 of the session.

1 Sec. 15. To Jane Worden, for extra service as clerk of the
2 house claims committee, one hundred dollars (\$100.00); to Maude
3 Johnson, for extra service as clerk of the senate claims committee,
4 one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

1 Sec. 16. To Maxine Smith for extra service as clerk of the
2 house appropriations committee, one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

1 Sec. 17. To Frances Cody, for extra service as clerk of
2 the senate appropriations committee, one hundred dollars (\$100.00);
3 to Hope Hull, for extra service for the senate appropriations com-
4 mittee, one hundred dollars (\$100.00); to Charles Royer, for extra
5 service as clerk of senate judiciary 1, thirty dollars (\$30.00);
6 to Evelyn Wilkins, for extra service as clerk of senate judiciary
7 2 and as clerk of the senate sifting committee, one hundred dollars
8 (\$100.00).

1 Sec. 18. To Charles Royer, for copy of transcript of pro-
2 ceedings of the investigation of H. C. White, member of the board
3 of control, delivered to the Law Library at the close of the
4 Forty-seventh General Assembly, sixty-one dollars and twelve cents
5 (\$61.12), and to Charles Royer, for reporting and preparation of
6 transcript in re Kraschel hearing before senate judiciary 1,
7 twenty-two dollars and seventy cents (\$22.70).

1 Sec. 19. To A. C. Gustafson, chief clerk of the house of
2 representatives, the sum of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00), and
3 to Walter H. Beam, secretary of the senate, the sum of fifty
4 dollars (\$50.00), for postage and necessary expenses after the
5 close of the regular session of the Forty-eighth General Assembly.

1 Sec. 20. To the executive council, to pay for further
2 wiring for the loud-speaker system in the house, as provided in
3 House Resolution 16, five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or so much
4 thereof as may be necessary.

1 Sec. 21. A sum sufficient to pay the per diem compensation
2 made necessary by House Concurrent Resolution 23 for services re-
3 quired by officers and employees of the Forty-eighth General
4 Assembly after final adjournment.

1 Sec. 22. The state comptroller is hereby authorized and
2 directed to draw warrants and the treasurer of state to pay the
3 same, in the amounts appropriated herein, upon certification by
4 the speaker and chief clerk of the house of representatives for
5 house expense, and by the president and secretary of the senate
6 for senate expense, or upon certification by the secretary of
7 the executive council under the provisions of sections seven (7)
8 and twenty (20) of this act.

1 Sec. 23. This act being deemed of immediate importance
2 shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and
3 publication in the Boone News Republican, a newspaper published
4 at Boone, Iowa, and in the Waterloo Daily Courier, a newspaper
5 published at Waterloo, Iowa.
