## A BILL FOR

An Act to amend section three thousand eight hundred twenty-eight and fifty-one thousandths (3828.051), to repeal section three thousand eight hundred twenty-eight and fifty-three thousandths (3828.053), to amend section three thousand eight hundred twenty-eight and fifty-five thousandths (3828.055), to amend section three thousand eight hundred twenty-eight and fifty-six thousandths (3828.056), to repeal section three thousand eight hundred twenty-eight and fifty-seven thousandths (3828.057), to amend section three thousand eight hundred twenty-eight and fifty-eight thousandths (3828.058), to amend section three thousand eight hundred twenty-eight and sixty-one thousandths (3828.061), to amend section three thousand eight hundred twenty-eight and sixty-four thousandths (3828.064), and to amend section three thousand eight hundred twenty-eight and sixty-five thousandths (3828.065), Code, 1939, relating to relief for honorably discharged men and women of the United States who have served in the military or naval forces of the United States during any war in which the United States was engaged.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

- 1 Section 1. Section three thousand eight hundred
- 2 twenty-eight and fifty-one thousandths (3828.051), Code,
- 3 1939, is amended by striking all after the word "indigent"
- 4 in lines seven (7) and eight (8), and substituting therefor

5 “men and women of the United States who served in the  
6 military or naval forces of the United States in any war,  
7 and their indigent wives, widows and minor children not  
8 over eighteen years of age, having a legal residence in  
9 the county.”.

1 Sec. 2. Section three thousand eight hundred  
2 twenty-eight and fifty-three thousandths (3828.053), Code,  
3 1939, is repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:  
4 “Said funds shall be disbursed by the soldiers  
5 relief commission which shall consist of three  
6 persons, all of whom shall be honorably dis-  
7 charged men or women of the United States who  
8 served in the military or naval forces of the  
9 United States in any war. Said membership  
10 shall at all times, as near as possible, be  
11 equally divided among the men and women who  
12 served in the Spanish American War, World War  
13 I and World War II.”

1 Sec. 3. Section three thousand eight hundred  
2 twenty-eight and fifty-five thousandths (3828.055), Code,  
3 1939, is amended by adding thereto the following:  
4 “In the event the commission has employed  
5 administrative or clerical help, the members  
6 of the commission shall receive compensation  
7 for attendance at the annual and monthly  
8 meetings only.”

1     Sec. 4. Section three thousand eight hundred  
2     twenty-eight and fifty-six thousandths (3828.056), Code,  
3     1939, is amended by adding the following:

4     “The commission shall have power to employ  
5     necessary secretarial or clerical assistants  
6     when needed, the compensation of such employees  
7     to be fixed by the Board of Supervisors, but  
8     no member of the commission shall be so employed.”

1     Sec. 5. Section three thousand eight hundred  
2     twenty-eight and fifty-seven thousandths (3828.057), Code,  
3     1939, is repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

4     “The commission shall meet monthly on the first  
5     Monday and at such other times as may be neces-  
6     sary. At the monthly meeting it shall determine  
7     who are entitled to relief and the probable  
8     amount required to be expended therefor. The  
9     commission shall meet annually on the second  
10    Monday in June. At such annual meeting it shall  
11    prepare an estimated budget for all expenditures  
12    to be made in the next fiscal year and certify  
13    said budget to the Board of Supervisors, who  
14    shall levy a sufficient tax to raise the amount  
15    of the estimated budget.”

1     Sec. 6. Section three thousand eight hundred  
2     twenty-eight and fifty-eight thousandths (3828.058), Code,  
3     1939, is amended by striking from lines two (2) to seven (7)

4 inclusive thereof the following:

5 "Upon the filing of the list with the board  
6 of supervisors, the county auditor shall,  
7 within twenty days thereafter, transmit to the  
8 township clerks in the county the names of  
9 those, if any, to whom relief has been awarded,  
10 and the amount."

1 Sec. 7. Section three thousand eight hundred twenty-  
2 eight and sixty-one thousandths (3828.061), Code, 1939, is  
3 amended by striking from line seven (7) the words "soldier,  
4 sailor, marine, or nurse" and substituting therefor the words  
5 "man or woman".

1 Sec. 8. Section three thousand eight hundred twenty-  
2 eight and sixty-four thousandths (3828.064), Code, 1939, is  
3 amended by striking from lines eight (8) and nine (9) the  
4 words "soldier, sailor, marine, or nurse" and substituting  
5 therefor the words "man or woman".

1 Sec. 9. Section three thousand eight hundred twenty-  
2 eight and sixty-five thousandths (3828.065), Code, 1939, is  
3 amended by striking from line seven (7) the words "deceased  
4 soldier or sailor" and substituting therefor the words "such  
5 deceased service man or woman".

1 Sec. 10. Chapter one hundred eighty-nine and two  
2 tenths (189.2), Code, 1939, is amended by adding thereto a new  
3 section as follows:

4 "The state auditor shall prepare a uniform

5 system of accounting and case records for  
6 the use of all county soldiers relief  
7 commissions, which records shall be available  
8 for purchase by the several counties.”

1 Sec. 11. Chapter one hundred eighty-nine and two  
2 tenths (189.2), Code, 1939, is amended by adding thereto a new  
3 section as follows:

4 “It shall be unlawful for the board of supervisors  
5 of any county or the soldiers relief commission of  
6 any county to place the administration of the duties  
7 of the soldiers relief commission under any other  
8 relief agency of any county, or to publish the  
9 names of the veterans or their families who receive  
10 relief under the provisions of this chapter.”

## A BILL FOR

AN ACT to amend Section Nine hundred thirty-nine (939),  
Code, 1939, relating to the form of the affidavit  
for the envelope for the absent voter's ballot.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

1 Section 1. Section Nine hundred thirty-nine (939),  
 2 Code, 1939, is amended by substituting a semi-colon (;)  
 3 for the period (.) following the word "years" in  
 4 line twelve (12) and inserting after said semi-colon (;)  
 5 the following: "date of birth .....,  
 6 (month)  
 7 ....., ....."  
 8 (day) (year)

1 Sec. 2. This act, being deemed of immediate  
 2 importance, shall go into effect following its  
 3 publication in the....., a newspaper  
 4 published at....., Iowa, and in the  
 5 ....., a newspaper published at  
 6 ....., Iowa.
