A BILL FOR

An Act to amend sections four hundred ten point six (410.6), and four hundred ten point five (410.5), Code 1946, relating to pension funds and annual assessments therefor, and providing that the same shall be applicable to certain deputy bailiffs of municipal courts in cities having a population of one hundred twenty-five thousand or more.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Section four hundred ten point six (410.6),
2 Code 1946, is amended by adding thereto the following:
3 "For the purposes of this chapter, deputy bailiffs
4 with civil service rights, in municipal courts in
5 cities having a population of one hundred twenty-five
6 thousand or more, who have served regularly in such
7 capacity since prior to March 1, 1934, shall be entitled
8 to all of the benefits provided under this section from
9 the date of their original appointment to said office
10 upon the payment by them of membership fees and
11 assessments as hereinafter provided."

1 Sec. 2. Section four hundred ten point five (410.5),
2 Code 1946, is amended by adding thereto the following:
3 "Any deputy sheriff with civil rights, in

4 municipal courts in cities having a population of
5 one hundred twenty-five thousand or more, who has
6 served regularly in such capacity since prior to
7 March 1, 1934, who desires to receive the benefits
8 under the provisions of this chapter, shall first
9 pay to the treasurer of the board of trustees
10 administering said pension funds, a membership fee
11 to be fixed by the board of trustees of such funds
12 not exceeding five dollars and shall also first pay
13 to the treasurer of the board of trustees administering
14 said pension funds an amount in cash equal to one percent
15 of the total salary which shall have been received by
16 said deputy bailiff from the time of his appointment
17 as such deputy bailiff to the date of his coming under
18 the provisions of this chapter, and, in addition
19 thereto, shall thereafter be required to pay to the
20 treasurer of said board of trustees administering said
21 pension funds, an amount equal to one percent upon the
22 total amount of annual salary received by said deputy
23 bailiff from the commencement of the period of time
24 when said deputy bailiff comes under the provisions of
25 this chapter, which amount shall be paid so long as
26 said deputy bailiff shall be employed as such, and
27 which assessment shall be deducted and retained by the
28 city in equal monthly installments out of his salary.”

1 **Sec. 3.** This act shall not apply to deputy bailiffs

2 employed after the effective date of chapter three hundred
3 twenty-two point one (322.1), Code 1939, now known as chapter
4 four hundred eleven (411), Code 1946.

1 **Sec. 4.** In event that any phrase, clause, or section
2 of this act be found to be unconstitutional for any reason,
3 such unconstitutionality shall not have the effect of
4 invalidating those other portions of this act which may be
5 found to be constitutional, but those other portions which
6 are found to be constitutional shall continue to remain and
7 be in full force and effect.
