A BILL FOR

An Act to amend Chapter ninety-two (92), Code 1954, relating
to the employment of minors.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

This is a Companion Bill; for complete text see Senate File 91.

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 201

This bill seeks to meet modern industrial conditions and the educational needs of youth by prohibiting their employment under 16 years of age during school hours except for those working in school-supervised programs or those legally out of school; and by requiring work permits for all workers 14 to 16 years of age in any gainful occupation outside of school hours, not just in certain listed occupations as now. It would extend summer work to 8 p.m., instead of 6 p.m. It WOULD NOT APPLY to work outside of school hours in agriculture, in domestic service in private homes, in temporary odd jobs, or in work for parent or guardian in other than dangerous occupations. The recent White House Conference on Children recognized that many employment laws applying to children should be brought up to date.
