A BILL FOR

An Act relating to institutions under the jurisdiction of the board of control.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Sections two hundred eighteen point seventy-
2 eight (218.78) through two hundred eighteen point eighty
3 (218.80), Code 1966, are hereby repealed.

1 Sec. 2. Section two hundred eighteen point nine (218.9),
2 Code 1966, is hereby amended as follows:

3 1. By striking from line nine (9) the words "corrective
4 institutions" and inserting in lieu thereof the words
5 "rehabilitation services".

6 2. By inserting in line fifteen (15) after the word "girls,"
7 the words "the Iowa Annie Wittenmyer home, the juvenile home,".

8 3. By striking all of lines seventeen (17) through twenty-
9 four (24) and inserting in lieu thereof the words "rehabilita-
10 tion services for administration."

11 4. By striking from line twenty-seven (27) the word ", di-
12 rector" and line twenty-eight (28) and from line twenty-nine
13 (29) the word "welfare" and inserting in lieu thereof the
14 words "or the director of rehabilitation services".

1 Sec. 3. Section two hundred eighteen point thirty-four
2 (218.34), Code 1966, is hereby amended by striking all of such
3 section after the word "agents" in line four (4) and inserting
4 in lieu thereof the following:

5 ", community service workers, and family counselors for the

6 training school for boys, the training school for girls, the
7 juvenile home, and the Iowa Annie Wittenmyer home."

1 Sec. 4. Section two hundred eighteen point seventy-six
2 (218.76), Code 1966, is hereby amended by striking from line
3 four (4) of subsection two (2) the words "corrective institu-
4 tions" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "rehabilitation
5 services".

1 Sec. 5. Section two hundred eighteen point seventy-seven
2 (218.77), Code 1966, is hereby amended by striking from line
3 one (1) the words "corrective institutions" and inserting in
4 lieu thereof the words "rehabilitation services".

1 Sec. 6. Section two hundred eighteen point eighty-two
2 (218.82), Code 1966, is hereby amended as follows:

3 1. By striking from lines two (2) and three (3) the words
4 "corrective institutions" and inserting in lieu thereof the
5 words "rehabilitation services".

6 2. By striking from lines one (1) and two (2) of subsec-
7 tion one (1) of such section the words "corrective institu-
8 tions" and insert in lieu thereof the words "rehabilitation
9 services".

1 Sec. 7. Section two hundred eighteen point ninety-one
2 (218.91), Code 1966, is hereby amended by striking from line
3 two (2) the words "corrective institutions" and inserting in
4 lieu thereof the words "rehabilitation services".

1 Sec. 8. The director of rehabilitation services under the
2 direction of the board of control shall:

3 1. Establish and administer, under policies prescribed by
4 the board, a department of correctional services, a department
5 of children and youth services, a department of mental health
6 services, and a department of camp services.

7 2. Visit and examine all institutions under his jurisdic-
8 tion to determine that such institutions are being operated
9 as specified in policies established by the board of control
10 and that adequate and proper programs have been implemented.

11 3. Determine the qualifications of assistant directors,
12 wardens, superintendents, and other personnel responsible for
13 the care, custody, training, and discipline of inmates and
14 make recommendations to the board of control regarding the
15 qualifications.

16 4. Cooperate with other directors and department heads
17 under the board of control in the coordination of all func-
18 tions of the board of control.

19 5. Prepare a budget for the board of control which will pro-
20 vide for the execution of the duties and provide the programs
21 necessary to carry out the functions of the board of control.

1 Sec. 9. The department of correctional services shall
2 supervise the administration of the powers and duties of the
3 board of control relating to the men's reformatory, the state
4 penitentiary, the women's reformatory, and any other corrective
5 institution placed by the board of control under the division
6 of rehabilitation services for administration or relating to
7 the care, treatment, or rehabilitation of persons committed
8 thereto.

1 Sec. 10. The supervisor of the department of correctional
2 services shall:

3 1. Assist the director of rehabilitation services in carry-
4 ing into effect the purposes of the penal, reformatory, and
5 other institutions assigned to the correctional services depart-
6 ment.

7 2. Establish and maintain acceptable standards of treatment,
8 training, and education in the various penal and corrective
9 institutions assigned to this department.

10 3. Examine all state institutions which are penal, reforma-
11 tory, or corrective in nature to determine their efficiency for
12 adequate care, custody, and training of their inmates and report
13 the findings to the board of control.

14 4. Develop a program, in the adult corrective institutions,
15 designed to rehabilitate the inmates, and institute programs
16 that will promote consideration for parole.

17 5. Supervise and assist the director of industries in
18 carrying out the provisions of section two hundred eighteen
19 point eighty-two (218.82) of the Code.

1 Sec. 11. The department of children and youth services
2 shall supervise the administration of the powers and duties
3 of the board of control relating to the training school for
4 boys, the training school for girls, the state juvenile home,
5 the Iowa Annie Wittenmyer home, and any other institution or
6 facilities placed by the board of control under the division
7 of rehabilitation services for administration or relating to
8 the care, treatment, education, training, or habilitation of
9 children or youths committed or placed in such institutions
10 or facilities.

1 Sec. 12. The supervisor of the department of children and
2 youth services shall:

3 1. Supervise all juvenile parole agents, family service
4 counselors, child welfare workers, and other community service
5 personnel carrying out the parole, placement, employment, and
6 supervision of state wards and other children and youth re-
7 leased for placement outside the institutions under the
8 control of this department.

9 2. Develop a program of basic education, recreation, voca-
10 tional training, guidance, and social adjustment for all children
11 and youth in such institutions, and periodically examine these
12 institutions to determine their efficiency and report the find-
13 ings to the board of control.

14 3. Cooperate with other sections, divisions, and departments
15 concerned with the general welfare of children and youth.

16 4. Establish, operate, and supervise residential off-campus
17 facilities such as group homes, foster homes, and other
18 facilities for the placement of children and youth.

1 Sec. 13. The department of mental health services shall
2 supervise the administration of the powers and duties of the
3 board of control relating to the Iowa security medical facility
4 or any other institution or facility for the care or treatment

5 of the mentally ill placed by the board of control under the
6 division of rehabilitation services.

1 Sec. 14. The supervisor of the department of mental health
2 services shall:

3 1. Establish and maintain acceptable standards of diag-
4 nosis, evaluation, treatment, and care of persons displaying
5 evidence of mental illness or psychosocial disorders requiring
6 a security setting.

7 2. Cooperate with institutions of higher learning in
8 establishing programs for the training of their students and
9 for the use of their staff in training staff personnel.

10 3. Establish programs and cooperate with institutions of
11 higher learning in conducting research to determine the cause
12 and methods of treatment and care of persons suffering from
13 psychosocial disorders or mental illness.

14 4. Establish programs for the rehabilitation and training
15 of such persons for return to other institutional settings or
16 society.

1 Sec. 15. The department of camp services shall supervise
2 the administration of the powers and duties of the board of
3 control relating to release centers, all camps, rehabilitation
4 farms, off-campus facilities, work release units, and other
5 facilities which are developed and assigned to any such facil-
6 ity under the division of rehabilitation services.

1 Sec. 16. The supervisor of the department of camp services
2 shall:

3 1. Develop a program to prepare inmates of adult corrective
4 institutions for discharge or parole.

5 2. Institute programs to promote rehabilitation of trust-
6 worthy persons transferred to or committed to a camp or farm
7 environment.

8 3. Develop methods and techniques for the training of per-
9 sons placed on such rehabilitative farms in order to promote
10 efficient operation of such farming ventures or farm services.

11 4. Promulgate programs which have the primary purpose of

12 and provide for the inculcation or the activation of attitudes,
13 work skills, and habit patterns conducive to the rehabilita-
14 tion of inmates for return to society.

15 5. Establish such camp facilities now established and
16 those the board of control may designate for camp use for the
17 placement of inmates of institutions under the supervision of
18 the director of rehabilitation services.

19 6. Develop procedures to carry out the services for inmates
20 as provided by the work release. Establish facilities for
21 the housing of inmates and develop, with the assistance of
22 the proper authorities of political subdivisions of the state
23 or qualified public or private agencies, suitable housing for
24 the quartering of such inmates.
