SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa to give the governor item veto power on appropriation bills.

Be It Resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution
- 2 of the State of Iowa is hereby proposed:
- 3 Section sixteen (16) of article three (III) of the Constitution
- 4 of the State of Iowa is hereby amended by adding the following
- 5 new paragraph at the end thereof:
- 6 "The governor may approve appropriation bills in whole
- 7 or in part, and may disapprove any item of an appropriation
- 8 bill; and the part approved shall become a law. Any item
- 9 of an appropriation bill disapproved by the governor shall
- 10 be returned, with his objections, to the house in which
- 11 it originated, or shall be deposited by him in the office
- 12 of the secretary of state in the case of an appropriation
- 13 bill submitted to the governor for his approval during
- 14 the last three days of a session of the General Assembly,
- 15 and the procedure in each case shall be the same as provided
- 16 for other bills. Any such item of an appropriation bill

17 may be enacted into law notwithstanding the governor's
18 objections, in the same manner as provided for other bills."

1 Sec. 2. The foregoing proposed amendment, having been
2 adopted and agreed to by the Sixty-first (61st) General Assembly,
3 thereafter duly published, and now adopted and agreed to
4 by the Sixty-second (62nd) General Assembly in this Joint
5 Resolution, shall be submitted to the people of the State
6 of Iowa at the general election in November of the year
7 nineteen hundred sixty-eight (1968) in the manner required
8 by the Constitution of the State of Iowa and the laws of
9 the State of Iowa.
