## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the deliberate littering of public property,
- 2 and providing an appropriate penalty therefor.
- 3 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*
- 4 Section 1. Chapter one hundred eleven (111), Code 1966, is
- 5 hereby amended by adding thereto the following new section:
- 6 "No person shall place, cause to be placed, throw, or de-
- 7 posit any cans, bottles, garbage, rubbish, or debris of what-
- 8 soever nature into or upon any public area of this state.
- 9 Public areas shall include, but not be limited to, bodies of
- 10 water and watercourses and the shores and beaches thereof,
- 11 roadsides, parks, playgrounds, refuges, and conservation and
- 12 recreation areas. The court, in lieu of or in addition to
- 13 any other sentence imposed, may direct and supervise a labor
- 14 of litter gathering, including, but not limited to, the litter
- 15 connected with the particular violation. All public autho-
- 16 rities having supervision of public property in this state
- 17 shall establish and maintain on such property receptacles for
- 18 the deposit of litter and publicize the location thereof."
- 19 Sec. 2. Section one hundred six point twelve (106.12),
- 20 subsection three (3), Code 1966, as amended by chapter one

- 1 hundred twenty-five (125), section one (1), Acts of the
- 2 Sixty-second General Assembly, is hereby repealed.

EXPLANATION OF SENATE FILE 464

This bill strengthens the littering laws of Iowa by extending them to many diverse public areas.

This bill also allows a court to impose a penalty which includes supervised litter gathering. Authorities supervising public property are required to establish, maintain, and publicized the location of receptacles for the deposit of litter.
