#### EXPLANATION OF SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 7 AND PROPOSED COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

This proposed constitutional amendment contemplates that Senate Joint Resolution 1, Sixty-third General Assembly, which was recently passed for the second time, will be approved by the people. Hence, as does Senate Joint Resolution 1, this proposed amendment provides that the period of residence required for voting is to be determined by the general assembly within the maximum limitation of six (6) months in the state and sixty (60) days in the county. In addition this proposed amendment goes somewhat further in that it would provide that persons nineteen (19) years of age or older shall be deemed to be adults for all purposes known to the law and shall enjoy all rights and privileges and be subject to all the duties and liabilities now or hereafter provided by law for persons twenty-one (21) years old. Thus, such nineteen (19) year olds could vote in all elections, borrow money, make and be bound by contracts, and generally do any and all things which heretofore only persons twenty-one (21) years of age or older could do. The proposed amendment does however, retain the minimum age requirements presently in the Constitution with respect to the holding of public offices. Thus, for example, a person would still have to be twenty-one (21) years of age in order to be a member of the General Assembly.
