A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the expenditure of state funds.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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1 Section 1. State funds appropriated for capital
2 expenditures pursuant to the following enumerated Acts, which
3 funds or portions thereof have not otherwise been expended
4 or committed by contract as of February 4, 1971 shall revert
5 to the general fund of this state on the effective date of
6 this Act. The Acts pursuant to which the funds in question
7 were appropriated are as follows:

8 1. Acts of the Sixty-second General Assembly, chapters
9 three (3), six (6), eleven (11), twenty-three (23), twenty-
10 eight (28), thirty-three (33), thirty-seven (37), forty (40),
11 and chapter seventy-four (74) as amended by chapter thirty-
12 seven (37), Acts of the Sixty-third General Assembly, Second
13 Session.

14 2. Acts of the Sixty-third General Assembly, First Session,
15 chapters eleven (11), sixteen (16), twenty (20), twenty-three
16 (23), twenty-four (24), section two (2) of chapter twenty-
17 six (26), chapters thirty-three (33), thirty-five (35), forty-
18 one (41), forty-two (42), forty-three (43), forty-nine (49),
19 fifty-five (55) as amended by chapter one thousand six (1006)
20 of the Acts of the Sixty-third General Assembly, Second
21 Session, and chapter sixty-eight (68).

22 3. Acts of the Sixty-third General Assembly, Second
23 Session, chapter one thousand two hundred five (1205), sections
24 seven (7) and fourteen (14).

25 Sec. 2. Notwithstanding any contrary statute, an executive
26 department or agency of this state shall not expend funds
27 for out-of-state travel between the effective date of this
28 Act and July 1, 1971, except when a request for such out-of-
29 state travel receives the approval of no less than three
30 members of the executive council after a showing by the
31 affected state department or agency that the out-of-state
32 travel will be of critically urgent value to the agency and
33 its employees and of substantial benefit to the state.

34 Sec. 3. Notwithstanding any contrary statute, an executive
35 department or agency of this state shall not hire or employ

1 any person in addition to those employed on the effective
2 date of this Act, between the effective date of this Act and
3 July 1, 1971, except as provided in this section. No vacancy
4 shall be filled by any executive department or agency except
5 as provided in this section. An executive department or
6 agency which desires to employ any person prior to July 1,
7 1971 shall do so only after receiving the approval of no less
8 than three members of the executive council upon a showing
9 by the affected state department or agency that if a person
10 is not hired it will result in extreme hardship to the
11 department or agency or substantially affect the operation
12 of the department or agency. This section shall not prohibit
13 the hiring or employing of any person who will commence his
14 employment on July 1, 1971 or at any time thereafter.

15 Sec. 4. Notwithstanding any contrary statute, an executive
16 department or agency shall not rent or lease any office space
17 or real property between the effective date of this Act and
18 July 1, 1971 except as provided in this section. Any executive
19 department or agency which desires to rent or lease office
20 space or real property during the time between the effective
21 date of this Act and July 1, 1971 shall do so only after
22 receiving the approval of no less than three members of the
23 executive council upon a showing by the affected state
24 department or agency that if such office space or real property
25 is not rented or leased it will result in an extreme hardship
26 to the department or agency or substantially affect the
27 operation of the department or agency. This section shall
28 not affect any agreements executed for the rent or lease of
29 office space or real property prior to the effective date
30 of this Act.

31 Sec. 5. Notwithstanding any contrary statute, an executive
32 department or agency shall not purchase any motor vehicle,
33 equipment, or excessive amounts of supplies or printing between
34 the effective date of this Act and July 1, 1971, except when
35 a request for any such purchase receives the approval of no

1 less than three members of the executive council after a
2 showing by the department or agency that if a certain purchase
3 is not approved it will result in extreme hardship to the
4 department or agency or substantially affect the operation
5 of the department or agency.

6 Sec. 6. Section nineteen point seven (19.7), unnumbered
7 paragraph two (2), Code 1971, is amended as follows:

8 The proceeds of such loan shall be applied toward the pay-
9 ment of costs and obligations necessitated by such actual
10 or potential disaster and the reimbursement of local funds
11 from which such expenditures have been made. Any such project
12 for repair, rebuilding or restoration of state property for
13 which no specific appropriation has been made, ~~which-when-~~
14 ~~completed will-cost-more-than-one-hundred-thousand-dollars,~~
15 shall, before work is begun thereon, be subject to approval
16 or rejection by the budget and financial control committee.

17 Sec. 7. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
18 shall take effect and be in force from and after its
19 publication in The Sheldon Mail, a newspaper published in
20 Sheldon, Iowa, and in Chariton Herald-Patriot, a newspaper
21 published in Chariton, Iowa.

22 EXPLANATION

23 This Act provides that moneys not expended or committed
24 by contract which were appropriated in designated Acts for
25 capital expenditures shall revert to the general fund of the
26 state. The Act limits out-of-state travel for executive
27 department employees of this state up to July 1, 1971, prevents
28 the hiring of new employees by such departments through July
29 1, 1971, except when a definite need can be shown, and prevents
30 the leasing and renting of office space and real property
31 up to July 1, 1971 except when a definite need can be shown.
32 If similar restrictions need to be provided beyond July 1,
33 1971 it is anticipated that they can be provided within
34 individual appropriation bills effective commencing July 1,
35 1971.

1 The Act also prevents executive departments and agencies
2 from purchasing motor vehicles, equipment, and large quantities
3 of supplies. It requires all payments to be made out of the
4 state contingency fund to be approved by the budget and
5 financial control committee as well as the executive council.
