### A BILL FOR

1 An Act making an appropriation from the general fund of the  
2 state of Iowa to various state departments and their  
3 divisions, and transferring and appropriating from certain  
4 departmental funds.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund  
 2 of the state for each fiscal year of the biennium beginning  
 3 July 1, 1971 and ending June 30, 1973, for the following state

3 of the departments and divisions receiving funds under this  
4 Act are appropriated for the purpose set forth in the fed-  
5 eral grants or receipts.

6 Sec. 3. No moneys appropriated by this Act shall be used  
7 for capital improvements, except such expenditures as may  
8 be made in connection with maintenance and training facili-  
9 ties required by the military division of the department of  
10 public defense and except such expenditures from funds ap-  
11 propriated to the superintendent of public buildings and  
12 grounds when approved by the executive council.

13 Sec. 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight  
14 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, all unencumbered or  
15 unobligated balances of appropriations made by this Act for  
16 the first fiscal year of the biennium commencing July 1, 1971  
17 shall, on September 30, 1972, revert to the state treasury  
18 and to the credit of the fund from which appropriated. The  
19 agencies, departments and commissions to which appropriations  
20 are made by this Act may make application to the committees  
21 on appropriations for the reappropriation of any funds that  
22 do revert, or probably will revert upon the dates herein set

27 (8.33) of the Code shall apply to appropriations made for

30 cal year of such biennium shall be subject to section eight  
31 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code.

34 for the biennium.
